

UNIVERSITY NOTES.

ATHLETES CONTEST FOR THE FIELD-DAY TEAM.

The University of Southern California Athletic Association held its home field day and track meet at Agricultural Park yesterday afternoon. Several hundred spectators watched the sports, which were interesting. The local meet was held to determine the men who shall represent the university in the dual intercollegiate field day with the students of Pomona College to be held at Pomona next Thursday.

The events yesterday were hotly contested; in many instances good records were made and there were many exciting finishes. The most exciting and closest match of the day was the half mile relay race. Two teams of four men were entered, each man running an eighth of a mile. Each lap was run in good time and the teams were evenly matched. In the sprints fair time was made. The longer runs were also made in good time with the exception of the mile run. In that event there was a scarcity of pace-makers. The hot weather also made speed difficult. Average records were made in the high and broad jumps. The university team is especially strong in the weight events.

The first race was called at 2:30. Van Den Bergh Oates and C. Enyeart faced the line for the 220-yard dash. Oates got away first but Van Den Bergh drew away at the finish, winning easily in 0:24 $\frac{1}{4}$. Oates was second.

In the running broad jump, Miller cleared 18 feet 6 inches, and won. J. S. Ferguson was a close second.

Crowell won the mile run. Smith crossed the tape only a few inches behind. The men loafed in the early part of the game. As a result the time was very poor, 5:24 $\frac{1}{4}$.

Miller captured the 100-yard dash, in 0:11. W. R. Gulberson second.

In the 16-pound shot put, N. G. Gulberson scored 37 feet, and won; R. Ferguson second.

W. R. Gulberson won the 120-yard hurdle race in 0:18.

The 440-yard run was won by R. Ferguson; Smith was second, with L. S. Enyeart and Hasson close up; time 0:54 $\frac{1}{4}$.

N. G. Gulberson tossed the 16-pound hammer 130 feet and carried off the honors; W. R. Gulberson second.

In the running high jump, Miller and J. S. Ferguson tied at 5 feet 3 inches.

The half mile relay was won by the team composed of Crowell, C. Enyeart, Smith and R. Ferguson. Each man ran a lap of 220 yards. The second team was ahead till the last lap. L. S. Enyeart, Oates, Flint and Hassen were the losers. R. Ferguson made a star finish, and overcame the lead of the rival team, winning in 1:44.

The men taking first and second places qualified for the intercollegiate contest.
