TO MEET ON SATURDAY.**

University Tennis Players Prepare for the Tournament with Pomona—Baseball is the Next Sport to Claim Attention.

Next Saturday afternoon the athletes of the University of Southern California and Occidental College will hold a field day on the University track, at West Los Angeles. This is the first meet between these institutions in track athletics, although they were until last year both members of the Southern California Intercollegiate Association. The most hotly-contested events will probably be the 100, 220 and 440-yard dashes, the relay race, the pole vault and the high jump. The events will be the same as in the Pomona-U.S.C. meet, with the exception of the 120-yard hurdle, which has been dropped from the programme.

For the University, Woodward, who broke the intercollegiate record in the 220-yard dash last Friday at Santa Monica, will probably take this event. Fergusson may be counted upon to win the shot put, although he will compete with a much stronger man than the Pomona representative. Miller will doubtless win the high jump for the Methodist collegians. Knowles and Enyeart will again represent U.S.C. in the pole vault.

At the Presbyterian College Dean Cromwell has the most experience of any of the members of the track team, having in '98 represented his school in five events. He should carry off the honors in the hammer throw, as he has a record of 130 feet. Horace Clelland will be among the Occidental sprinters. R. R. Service, Berkeley's crack one-half-mile man, will also be on the team. The 100-yard dash should be a close race between Clelland and Woodward, U.S.C.'s star sprinter. Clelland will also run in the 220-yard dash, and in the relay race. Dwight E. Chapin will represent his school in the mile race, pole vault and broad jump. Harry Dane is a new man at track work, but is making good time in the 440-yard run.

The following is the order of events and the men who will represent their colleges:

The 100-yard dash: Occidental—Clelland and Bazata; U.S.C.—Woodward and Wilson.

Shot put: Occidental—Cromwell and Bazata; U.S.C.—Fergusson and Broderson.

High jump: Occidental—Chapin and Hancock; U.S.C.—Miller and Broderson.

The 440-yard run: Occidental—Dane and Dilworth; U. S. C.—Woodward and Smith.

The 220-yard dash: Occidental—Clelland and Hagerman; U. S. C.—Woodward and Fergusson.

Hammer throw: Occidental—Cromwell and Buell; U.S.C.—Holland and Broderson.

Mile run: Occidental—Chapin and Dilworth; U.S.C.—Smith and Fergusson.

Broad jump: Occidental—Bazata and Chapin; U.S.C.—Miller and Enyeart.

Pole vault: Occidental—Chapin and Cromwell; U.S.C.—Knowles and Enyeart.

Mile relay: Occidental—Clelland, Bazata, Dane and Hagerman; U.S.C.—Woodward, Fergusson, Wilson and Smith.
