FERGUSSON THE HERO.

The University of Southern California held its local field day yesterday afternoon on the campus. A very creditable showing was made in the dashes. The field events were, with the exception of the hammer throw and shot-put, very tame. Parsons proved a surprise in the 100 and 220-yard dashes. Townsend was picked for a sure winner, but Parsons won easily in the 100-yard, and, in spite of a poor start, captured the 220-yard run in 24s flat.

Fergusson was the hero of the day in the field events. He won the shot-put easily at 34ft. 3in., and could evidently have done much better. The hammer throw was the sensational event, Fergusson making the phenomenal throw of 125ft. Summary:

The 100-yard dash: Parsons first. Townsend second, Bailey third time 10 2-5s.

High jump: Broderson first, Miller second, Strickland third; height 5ft. 2 1/2

Pole vault: Ham first, Woodward second, Odell third; height 8ft. 9in.

Hammer throw: Fergusson first, Bickford second, Miller third; distance 125ft. 5in.

Shot-put: Fergusson first, Broderson second, Miller third; distance 34ft. 3in.

The 220-yard dash: Parsons first, Townsend second, Bailey third; time 24s. flat.

Mile run: Flick first, Hubbard second, Bovard third; time 5m. 26s.

Broad jump: Edwards first, Woodward second, Broderson third; distance 19ft. 8in.

It was too late to run the hurdles, 440-yard dash and the relay race; these events will be decided next Thursday afternoon.
