

# BERKELEY HAS EASY TIME WITH U. S. C.

**B**ERKELEY, April 12.—[Exclusive Dispatch.] The varsity track team of the university defeated the track team of the University of Southern California this afternoon in the dual meet by the score of 80½ to 32½. The southern athletes would undoubtedly have made a larger score had Parsons been in the sprint, but he did not attend the meet. Of the remainder of the score, Richardson made thirteen points, winning first in the hammer throw and high jump and second place in the shot-put.

The showing of the California team was by far the best it has made this season and especially in the sprint was the strength of the Blue and Gold shown, for they secured all three places in the hundred-yard dash as well as first and second in both the 220 and 440. The mile run produced a beautiful sprint at the finish between De Mamiel of California and Nordahl. Mamiel led all the way till within a few yards of the finish but lost by a very short distance in a heart-breaking finish. Stanton ran a beautiful race in the 440, leading all the way and winning as he pleased in 52½ seconds.

## JOHNS BEATS STANTON.

The surprise of the day, however, came in the 220, when Johns of California won by a few inches from Stanton. It was the prettiest race of the day, the men being bunched right to the finish, when Johns and Stanton drew away, with Johns a few inches in the lead. By his running today Johns promises to develop into one of the speediest sprinters the university has ever had.

The high hurdles were run in the fast time of 16 1-5 seconds, California

winning all three places with Johns, Cowels and Frei. In the low hurdles, however, the southerners almost reversed it, Lennox winning first place and Elliott second.

The varsity half-milers showed up in better form than they have before this season, Dozier, Leggett and Yost, finishing in the order named in 2.04 1-5. On the whole, the prospect looks far brighter for a victory in the meet with Stanford than at any other time this season. The results were as follows:

The 440-yard dash: Stanton (C) won, McNamara (C) second, Jones (U.S.C.) third; time 52 1-5.

Two-mile run: Deremer (C) won, Hobart (C) second, Newman (C) third; time 10.21.

Shot-put: Biddleman (C) won, Richardson (U.S.C.) second, Twitchell (C) third; distance 38 feet 5 inches.

The 220-yard dash: Johns (C) won, Stanton (C) second, Schute (U.S.C.) third; time 23 2-5 secs.

High jump: Richardson (U.S.C.) won, Bull (C) second, Stout (C) third; height 5 feet 9 inches.

The 220-yard hurdles: Lennox (U.S.C.) won, Elliott (U.S.C.) second, Cowels (C) third; time 27 3-5 secs.

Half-mile run: Dozier (C) won, Leggett (C) second, Yost (C) third; time 2.04½.

Broad jump: Chandler (U.S.C.) won, Johns (C) second, Frei (C) third; distance 21 feet 2 1-4 inches.

Relay race: Won by California.
