

# POOR SHOWING AT STANFORD.

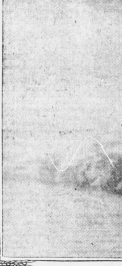
*U.S.C. Unable to Live Up to Former Contests.*

*Miller Runs Another Mile in Sensational Time.*

*Southern Team Takes Three First Places.*

STANFORD UNIVERSITY, March 27.—[Exclusive Dispatch.] The athletes from the University of Southern California failed to live up to expectations in their meet with the Cardinals this morning and were defeated by the score of 92½ to 29½, a showing not

quite up to that made in Los Angeles on the 16th.

Though the southerners had rather poor luck in having the star men show surprising reversals of form, the result must be attributed to splendid work on the part of the Stanford athletes.

Miller ran the half in only one second slower time than his record of last Saturday, covering the two laps in 1m. 59 1-2s, while Hemphill and Johnson shut out Gower, the U.S.C. entry for a place.

Hemphill of Stanford negotiated a beautiful race in the mile and ran ill off his feet in the last lap while Fletcher forced the Methodist runner to third. The time of 4m. 35 4-5s. in this race was too fast for Hall and he was too ill to enter the two mile, thus giving Stanford three places without a contest.

Martin did not run up to form in the hundred, taking third in a 19 3-5s. race, though he pulled a close second in the 220-yard dash in 23 1-2s.

The Southerners came to the fore in the low hurdles when Lennox won from Captain Horton by a splendid spurt over the last barrier in 24 1-5s.

In the 120-yard hurdles Stanford turned the tables when Morris and Feeble came in ahead of Lennox in 16 4-5s. Byrek, who on form should have taken points for U.S.C., but was indisposed and not in condition to run his usual race.

## LONG STRIDE WINS.

Reed ran a great race for U.S.C. in the quarter but Miller's long stride wore the plucky little southerner out on the back stretch so that both Miller and Wyman pulled away on the straightaway, leaving Reed a bad third.

The high jump was another victory for Southern California, though the Cardinal jumpers followed close. Murray secured first by a leap of 5ft. 9in., clearing the bar in beautiful form, but failed when the bar was raised another inch. Poor of Stanford, took second

at one inch lower and Waring, Stanford, tied with Earl for third.

The broad was also a surprise in favor of Stanford as Stolz captured first, which had been conceded to the visitors. Earl and Goodsell jumped in poor form, tying for second.

In the weights a paltry third was the best the Methodists could secure, Burek taking one point in the hammer at 115 feet, while Trotter annexed one in the shot at 42ft. 5in.

Crawford, Stanford, won both weight events and set good marks in each, tossing the shot 43ft. 10½in. and dropping the hammer out 142 feet. Horton took both seconds, putting the shot 43ft. 6½in.

The pole vault was clearly a walk-over for U.S.C., as Richardson captured the event at 11ft. with Waring, Stanford, second, at 10ft. 6in.

The relay was expected to be a close contest throughout, but Stolz, a new man at 352 yards, gave Stanford a lead in the first lap, which was never cut down and Wyman romped home a winner by twenty-five yards, though Lennox struggled hard on the last lap and materially lessened the Stanford advantage.
