

SMALL SQUAD IS THE LOSER.

*Throop Wins Both Sprints
from Coleman.*

*Lennox Takes Low Hurdles,
But Loses High.*

*Relay Won by Stanford from
the U.S.C. Team.*

STANFORD UNIVERSITY, March 28.—(Exclusive Dispatch.) Stanford, 20; U.S.C., 29. The small Methodist track squad made a gallant fight against the cardinal team this morning, but only won three first places out of the fourteen events.

The track was heavy and a bitter wind blew across the field. Rain fell until a few minutes before the event came off. Throop made good in both sprints, defeating Tom Coleman by a foot in the century and by about six inches in the furlong race.

The time was slow on account of the unfavorable conditions. In the short race, the speedy Methodist finished in 16 2-3s, and the time of the 220-yard dash was 22 2-3s. Smitherson broke down in the long race and did not finish. He crowded Martin out of third place in the hundred-yard dash. The half-mile run was the hardest fought event of the meet. Johnston won in 7m. 3s., but Walton, the U.S.C. freshman, was abreast of him in the stretch and was beaten at the tape by less than a foot. Gower turned his ankle and fell down on the first lap and although he pluckily tried to overtake the flying bunch, he was hopelessly behind and Cromwell took him out of the race.

Lennox received a surprise package in the high hurdles, being pushed into third place. Peaslee, a Cardinal veteran, showed a flash of old-time form by taking first. Kern was second. The three place winners finished within a foot of each other.

Lennox redeemed himself by winning the low hurdles. Crawford won both weight events. His mark of 44 ft. 6 1/2 in. in the shot put was a foot better than Horton was able to do and Trotter of U.S.C. was only a half inch behind Horton.

Wyman and Carter did not run in the quarter mile race, but Stolz won in a walk. Wallace of U.S.C. finished third. Hall was beaten by Porter by ten yards in the mile run. The time was 4m. 28 2-3s. U.S.C. did not have any entries in the two-mile run.

Bellah won the pole vault at 11 ft. 11 1/2 in. and Scott and Richardson tied for second. The wet ground greatly handicapped the contestants in the jumps as well as those in the track events.

The five-man relay race was a walk-away for the Cardinal team. Stolz secured a long lead over Gower on the last lap and the other Stanford runners easily maintained the advantage.

Goodsell of U.S.C. failed to place in the broad jump. Walberg tied with Horne for second place in the high jump, at 4 ft. 8 in. Argabrite showed a return to form and won at 5 ft. 16 inches.

Coach Cromwell was not disappointed at the slaying of his men, as the cold weather proved a great handicap to the Methodists. However, the Cardinal athletes also were at a disadvantage on account of the unfavorable weather conditions.
