

U.S.C. Wins by Two and Two-Thirds Points.

U.S.C., 59 2-3; L.A. High School, 53 1-3.

"Len" Martin furnished the sensation of the U.S.C.-L.A. High track meet at Bovard Field yesterday when he defeated Waldo Throop, the Pacific Coast champion sprinter, in the 100-yard dash. Rubio, the high school sprinter and track captain, did not enter the race.

Throop, peeved at being defeated by his less speedy running mate in the century, dug into the 220 sprint, ran one of the prettiest races of his life and won from Martin by two yards. Johnson of high school, finished third in each event.

Coach Cromwell of the university practically gave the relay race to Los Angeles High School athletes when he entered Arthur Hill, who has not been training during the past semester, in the third lap. Hill is a speedy quarter-miler when in running shape but lacked the endurance to finish in the 440. Ireland, who ran against him, gained a long lead.

Kenneth Wallace started in the last lap fully twenty yards behind Ed Stanton who finished for High School. Slowly he crept up on the speedy prep runner and when three quarters around the course seemed likely to pass him. Stanton let out his final sprint, however, and finished with a 2-yard lead, winning the relay and bringing the hill-top team within six points of victory.

"Micky" McClure the High School runner who holds the Southern California interscholastic record in the 440-yard dash was out of the meet on account of sickness.

The handicap caused by the loss of Rubio and McClure placed High School at too great a disadvantage to win. With these runners in the tournament it hardly seems possible that the varsity could have rolled up a winning score.

Few close finishes marked the events. High School had the advantage in the weight events and the university pulled a majority of the points in the running.

The hammer throw: Richardson (U.S.C.) won, Pettingill (L.A.H.) second, Fisher (L.A.H.) third; distance, 125ft. 8in.

The shot put: Douglas (L.A.H.) won, Sheldon (L.A.H.) second, Dawson (L.A.H.) third; distance, 41ft. 6in.

The discuss hurl: McFie (L.A.H.) won, Bogart (U.S.C.) second, Sheldon (L.A.H.) third; distance, 107ft. 4in.

The pole vault: Richardson (U.S.C.) won, Watkins (U.S.C.) second, Condee (L.A.H.) third; height, 11ft.

The high jump: McFie (L.A.H.) won, Godbe, Chaffee (U.S.C.) and Rodman (L.A.H.) tied for second; height, 5ft 6in.

The broad jump: Dawson (L.A.H.) won, Bradway (L.A.H.) second, Short (U.S.C.) third; distance, 21ft. 2 1-2in.
