

U.S.C. CAPTURES TWELVE FIRSTS.

Martin Defeats Baer in the Century Dash.

Hansen Springs Surprise by Winning Two-twenty.

Dill Defeats Stine in the High Hurdle Event.

The U.S.C. track team grabbed the track meet from Occidental College yesterday afternoon, by the large score of 51 to 42. The university men had the best of the Tigers in nearly every event, winning twelve of the fifteen first places and taking their full share of seconds and thirds.

The most exciting race of the day was the 100-yard dash won by Martin of U.S.C. The time was not equal to Martin's record, but the fight in this race was the hardest fought of the afternoon.

Much trouble was caused in the starting of the race. The first time that the men were on their marks some one jumped the gun. The next attempt was ruined by the pistol snapping. Five ineffectual attempts were made before the men were off, and it was not till they had gone through the tension of coming to their marks six times that they were able to get off together.

This delay was responsible for the time, which was one-fifth of a second slower than Baer and Martin have run it before this season.

In the 20-yard race, Hansen of U.S.C. surprised everybody by winning second place and beating Baer of Occidental to the tape. All the dope sheets had figured the race between Martin and Baer, but Hansen took second after the first hundred yards, and ran Martin a close second, finishing but a few feet behind him.

Schoonover of Occidental, who was expected to run Hall a close race in the last half mile, did not finish. Hall took the lead from the start, and kept it for the whole distance, winning in the fast time of 2 min. 4 sec.

DILL TAKES STICKS.

The low hurdles developed into a pretty race between Dill of Occidental and Stine of U.S.C. Dill had already won the high hurdles in 16 1-5 sec., which is the fastest time registered by any college man in the south this year. The Occidental supporters were looking to him to do the trick in the low stick event.

Stine and Dill took the pistol together, and for the first 100 yards they ran neck and neck. As they came around the turn Dill's foot caught on a hurdle and he was unable to regain his stride. The two men finished close together, and they should be able to pull off one of the prettiest races of the conference meet in the low-stick event.

Another surprise of the meet was Bradbeer's defeat in the 440 yard dash by Wallace of U. S. C. Bradbeer, who is captain of the Tiger team, holds the Southern California record for that distance. His supporters were confident that he would take first in this event, but before the men had completed half the distance Wallace had passed him and he finished well ahead.

In the field events the two teams broke about even. U. S. C. took the most first places but Occidental evened up the score by taking all three places in the discus. Bogart, who throws the discus for the University, was unable to compete and this was responsible for the Tigers' walk-over.

The weather was too cold for the men to do their best and at least a fifth of a second was cut from each of the sprints by the chill east wind that blew down the track.

The result of this meet seems to indicate that the fight when they come together in the Conference, will be between U. S. C. and Pomona.
