

KELLEY WINS AT STANFORD.

Trojan Hardier Takes the 110-Meter Event.

Records Smashed Right and Left in Great Meet.

Horine Sets Another World's Mark in High Jump.

STANFORD UNIVERSITY, May 18.—Three world's records and five Olympic records were broken, one world's and one Olympic record were tied and still another record was approached within one-thirtieth of a second today, at the Pacific Coast Olympic trials on the Stanford oval. Horine of the Olympic Club of San Francisco, with a wonderful new mark of 6ft. 7in. in the running high jump— $\frac{1}{2}$ of an inch better than his own, world's record, and Halph Ross Olympic Club, with a new Olympic and world's record in the shot put of 80ft. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. right and left hand aggregate, were the two particular stars.

Forrest Southam (unattached) was a surprise of the trials. The world's record holder in the 110-meter hurdles finished third. Fred Kelly (U.S.C.) was in 15 2-8s., three-fifths of a second slower than Southam's best time.

Ira Courtney (Seattle A.C.) tied the Olympic record of 19 4-8s. in the 100-meter dash.

Running high jump, Olympic record, 6ft. 6in., held by Porter, America; Won by George Horine (Olympic Club,) 6ft. 7in. (new world's record,) second; Edward Rossen (U.C.) 6ft. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. Previous world's record, 6ft. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., Horine, 1912.

The 200 meters, Olympic record 21 3-8s., held by Hahn, America; Won by Ira Courtney (Seattle A.C.) F. C. Gerhardt (Olympic,) second; Fred Kelly, (U.S.C.) third. Time, 21 1-8s.

Throwing the hammer, Olympic record 178 ft. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., held by Flannigan, America; Won by Earl Skattack (U.C.) 188ft. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.; Merie Alderman (Stanford,) second; Floyd Rice (U.C.) third, 168ft. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. Ross did not compete.

Throwing the javelin, Olympic record, 134ft. 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., held by Lemming, Sweden; Samuel Bellah (Multnomah,) won, 145ft. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.; Charles Morris (Olympic,) 141ft. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., second; Martin Hawkins (Multnomah,) 133ft. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., third. Rossiger did not compete.

Running broad jump, Olympic record, 26ft. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., held by Evans, America; Won by Fred Allen (U.C.) 26ft. 1in.; Harold Morrison (Stanford,) 25ft. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., second; Samuel Bellah (Multnomah,) 21ft. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., third; James Donahue, (Los Angeles A. C.) 21ft. 1in.

Throwing the discus, right and left hand, Olympic record, 134ft. 1-7in., held by Sheridan, America; Won by Merie Alderman (Stanford,) right hand, 135ft. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.; left hand, 84ft. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.

Standing high jump, Olympic record, 6ft. 6in., held by Kury, American; Won by Harold Morrison (Stanford,) 6ft. 10in.; Merie Alderman (Stanford,) 6ft. 8in., second; Walter Thomason (Seattle A. C.) 6ft. 4in.

The 2500 meters (24 laps;) Won by Oliver Millard (Olympic Club,) Time, 10m. 17 4-8s. Westley (Olympic) quit in twenty-second lap; Burke (Olympic) quit in third lap. New coast record.

The 500 meters, Olympic record, 1m. 42 1-8s., held by Sheppard, American; Won by Clarence Edmondson, (Seattle A. C.) E. M. Bennett (Stanford University,) second; A. F. Gates (Pastime A. C.) third. Time, 1m. 42 1-8s.

The 100 meter hurdles, record 1m., held by Southam, American; First heat won by Fred Kelly (U.S.C.) Time, 15 2-8s.; Forrest Southam (unattached) second; Charles Morris (Olympic,) third; Deming Martin (U.S.C.) fourth.

The 110 meter hurdles, second heat: Won by Ben Ward (Los Angeles A. C.) Martin Hawkins (Multnomah A. C.) second; E. Templeton (Olympic Club,) third. Time, 16 4-8s. Edward Rossen, (U.S.C.) disqualified; foul.

The 110 meter hurdles, final: Won by Fred Kelly (U.S.C.) Martin Hawkins (Multnomah A. C.) second; Forreg Southam, (unattached,) third. Time, 15 2-8s. Unplaced, Ben Ward (Los Angeles A. C.) E. Templeton and Charles Morris (Olympic.)

The 1500 meters, record 4m. 1 2-8s., held by Sheppard, America; Won by Walter Mecture (Multnomah Club,) John Burke (Olympic Club,) second. No other starters. Time, 4m. 1 2-8s.

The 100 meters, Olympic record, 16 4-8s., held by Walker, South Africa. Won by Ira Courtney (Seattle A. C.) Time, 16 4-8s. F. C. Gerhardt (Olympic Club,) second. Southam did not start.

Pole vault, Olympic record, 12ft. 7in., held by Gilbert and Cook, American; Won by Samuel Bellah (Multnomah,) height, 12ft. 7in. (new record); Bulware (Stanford) and Templeton (Olympic) tied for second at 12ft. 1in.

Trial for world's record by Bellah, no competition. 12ft. 8 1-2in. Record, 12ft. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.

Shot put, right and left hand: Olympic record, held by Ross, American; Won by Halph Ross, three new records. First record, right hand, 60ft. 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.; second record, right hand, 60ft. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.; left hand, 59ft. 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. Third record, right and left handed, 59ft. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.; previous record, right and left, 58ft. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. Floyd Rice (University of California) second, right hand, 57ft. 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. left hand, 57ft. 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.; aggregate, 57ft. 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.
