

# BOVARD DOES BIG THINGS IN NORTH.

## ARRANGES RUGBY SCHEDULE THAT LOOKS GOOD.

---

Fifteen of Both Universities to Meet Trojans on Local Field and Crack Australian Team to Cap Climax—Team to Play at Berkeley in October.

Manager Warren B. Bovard of the University of Southern California, will return home today, after one of the most successful trips ever made in the north by a southern manager.

He took Fred Kelly, the hurdler of the university to the Olympic try-outs at Stanford, and the big freshman ran away with the field over the 110-meter high barriers. After seeing his "hope" bring home the bacon, Bovard got busy with the managers at Stanford and Berkeley, with the result that one of the greatest Rugby schedules in the history of the game on the Coast was arranged.

The southern squad will meet the two northern teams during the earlier part of the season on the Bay City fields, and later will play match games with California and Stanford here, the dates for the local games will be placed on October 26 and Thanksgiving Day.

Another interesting athletic item was sent south by Bovard yesterday, when he announced that one of the best Rugby teams in the history of the game in Australia, will be sent over this fall. The Australians will be seen here in action some time in November.

Manager Bovard has put the inter-collegiate south still further on the State's athletic map by this trip, and deserves a world of credit for his pains and trouble. It will give the fans some of the best football for the past ten years and will arouse a Statewide college and university interest in the English game.
