

U.S.C. ATHLETES EASY WINNERS FROM BERKELEY.

Northerners Never Have a Chance at Any Stage of the Proceedings—Kelly Wins Every Event He Enters — Borgstrom Fails in Effort to Break the Coast Vaulting Record.

BERKELEY, March 29.—[Exclusive Dispatch.] U.S.C., 59; California freshmen, 42.

That tells the tale of the first Trojan invasion this season. The freshmen fought valiantly, but were no match for the husky southerners.

Kelly was the star of the day, taking first place in every event he entered. He surprised himself when he won the hundred in 10 1-5s. Borgstrom took the vault at 13ft. He attempted to break the Coast record, but lacked speed and gave up. Jackson saved the day in the relay and won by fifteen yards, after every one of his team mates had been defeated.

In the century dash Kelly lead off at the start, with Wadsworth pushing him hard. Carrigan crept up on Wadsworth and the California lad had a hard time touching the tape ahead of him. With a jump at the finish Kelly won by two yards.

In the high hurdles this fast Irishman took his time and, at the tape, almost stopped as he looked back at Prebble. His time was 15 4-5s.

CLARK IN FRONT.

Clark won the 440 from Laird by one foot. Laird got the pole and led in the race from the start, while Clark ran behind. On the finish straight-away Clark jumped forward. Laird struggled hard, but he was all in and Clark passed him and broke the tape.

Swiggett had it easy in the two-mile grind and won by fifty yards. His wonderful sprint at the finish brought the bleachers to their feet, cheering. The 880 Tipton took without trouble. He never varied his even stride and in the last lap came up from the rear in fine form.

EXCITING EVENT.

The 220 was the most exciting event of the day. Wadsworth led until the last fifty yards. Then Hodge found his stride and forged forward steadily, fought at every step by Wadsworth. Wadsworth lacked the steam for a sprint and Hodge breasted the tape a clean yard the winner.

Jackson deserves a medal for his relay race. He saved a five spot by his beautiful sprint in the last lap. Straub beat Cookman by three yards in the first lap. Hunt tore around to Woodruff, starting him on the third three yards ahead of Laird. Woodruff beat Laird and Cochran started the last lap leading Jackson by four yards. But not for long, the negro opened up and passed Cochran like a shot and tore to the finish fifteen yards the winner. Results:
