

FRED KELLY, CHAMPION, IS BEATEN IN HIGH HURDLES.

*Trojans Only Win Four First Places in Track Meet.
Tipton Fails to Place in Half-mile — No Remarkable
Time Made in Any Event—Shattuck Shows Old-time
Form—Northerners Clean up in Four Events.*

CALIFORNIA stole the track meet at Bovard Field from U.S.C. with about as much difficulty as a pick-pocket has in stealing pennies from a blind man. The Bears have about as much to boast over. The final, lopsided score was 84½ to 37¼.

There was one startling feature. The great and only Fred Kelly, champion high hurdler, was beaten in his own race in time that would make a high school boy blush. The man who turned the trick was Preble of California; the time was 16 1-5s. That is the first time that Kelly has been beaten in the high sticks in his college career.

To make matters worse Kelly was never in the race. At the halfway mark he was almost a hurdle behind. He made a frantic and futile effort to make up the distance and missed by about five yards.

They say that Kelly has been sick with a cold or something of the like. One thing is certain that the champion was decidedly off color and ran the poorest race of his life.

The meet itself was woefully one-sided. U.S.C. won only four first places. Kelly won the shot and low hurdles, while Howard Drew, of course, won both the 100 and 220.

California won all three places in the quarter, two-mile, half-mile and broad jump. The Trojans cleaned up in the shot put. It seems as if the Bears will never learn to put the sixteen-pounder.

There was a genuine surprise in the half-mile. Tipton failed to place and an added entry by the name of Miller, hitherto unknown, won, beating even Cuendette. Miller struck out in front and was almost 100 yards ahead at the end of the first quarter. Everybody but the men handling the stop watches thought he was put in to drag Tipton out. But he just kept on going. Tipton made a frantic effort to pull into second place on the last turn. The Trojans stood up and cheered. But while everybody was watching Tipton, Cuendette stole up behind him at a faster pace and shoved the Trojan captain into the also rans.

Torrance made a game fight in the

two-mile. The pace was too fast for him. He stumbled on the turn in the fourth lap. He picked himself up and ran on. He stumbled again and almost fell in front of the grand stand, but fought on. A man tried to stop him, but he pushed him aside and dove into the tunnel. Five or six Trojans ran after him. Torrance was next seen being carried into the training quarters by these men.

Shattuck proved that he was still the hammer thrower of old by tossing the weight 169ft. 3in. Had anybody else in any college in America done that it would be something to rave over. But that is only an appetizer for the Bear farmer.
