

FRESHMEN WIN FROM TOILERS.

HARRY LAMPORT IS TROJANS' NEW HERO.

Takes Three First Places from off the Spikes of His Former High School Team-mates—Warren Takes a Couple of Seconds and Doc Cook is in True Form.

The Manual Arts track team met defeat in a dual meet yesterday afternoon on their own field for the first time in two years when the Toilers were edged out by the unbeaten U.S.C. freshmen. The final score read as follows: U.S.C. Freshmen, 61; Manual Arts, 56.

Harry Lamport, former Manual star, was the big hero of the meet. In the feature event of the day, the 100-yard dash, he barely nosed out George Woods in the fast time of 10 2-5 seconds. After winning the low hurdles he captured the broad jump at 20 feet 10 3-4 inches.
