

BEARS DEFEAT SOUTH'S STARS.

Trojans and Kelly Again go Down Ingloriously.

The King is Nosed Out in the High Hurdles.

Shorty Miller Comes Across in the Mile.

BERKELEY, March 21.—The University of California track team took its final swing at the combined forces of the University of Southern California and the Los Angeles Athletic Club this afternoon on the Berkeley track. The result was an 87½ to 13½ victory for the Bears.

In all, the southern squad succeeded in taking only three of the fourteen first places. Two of these, the 100-yard dash and the broad jump, went to Harry Lamport of U.S.C. The other first place was won by "Shorty" Miller, the little Trojan miler.

KELLY BEATEN

Young Grunsky of California proved to be the hero of the meet. In the high hurdles he got away with a good yard lead over Fred Kelly of the athletic club and Gannier of U.S.C., and barely nosed the King into second place. The time was 15¾. This time was very good, as the hurdles were facing against the wind.

Not being satisfied with one victory, Grunsky came back in the low hurdles and won an easy victory over Gannier and H. Lamport of U.S.C. in 14¾. The meet opened with the mile run, in which Sullivan of California and Crippen and Miller of U.S.C. furnished most of the excitement. On the first turn all three runners started to sprint. Sullivan finished several yards in the lead of Miller, but was disqualified for cutting in ahead of Crippen on the turn.

LAMPORT IN FRONT.

Harry Lamport came to the front in the 100-yard dash by winning a close decision over Percoll of California. Fred Kelly finished a close third. After being nosed out of the victory, Percoll came back in the 200-yard dash and won by inches from Fred Kelly and Ken Johnson.

The half-mile brought out the two old rivals, Blanchard of California and Noel George of U.S.C. These boys have met twice before, each of them taking a race. George took the lead at the start and kept ahead until on the back stretch of the final lap, when Blanchard sprinted ahead, finishing only a couple of strides to the good. In this race Blanchard stepped out in 1m., which is the best time made on the Berkeley track this season. In the field events the Californians had things pretty much their own way, with the exception of the broad jump. In this event, Harry Lamport came through with his second first place of the day by leaping out 20ft. 5in., winning from Lutz Nichols by only an inch.

POLE A DRAW.

Nichols and Maurer were the only two to clear the bar at 11ft. 6in., but both failed to make 12ft. and the event was called a tie.

The high jump was one of the three field events in which the Bears took all there was to take. After three Bears had tied at 6ft., Lutz Nichols succeeded in clearing the bar at 6ft. 3in. in exhibition.

110-yard dash—Won by Percoll (C.) Kelly (Stars) second, Johnson (Stars) third; time, 22s. 100.

220-yard run—Won by Blanchard (C.) George (Stars) second, Palmer (C.) third; time, 1m. 52s.

440-yard dash—Won by Mody (C.) Pitts (C.) second, Kerr (C.) third; time, 21¾.

Shot put—Won by Liveredge (C.) Richardson (C.) second, McCutcheon (C.) third; distance, 45ft. 2¾.

Two-mile run—Won by Lloyd (C.) Humphrey (C.) second, Ofield (C.) third; time, 16m. 19¾.

225-yard hurdles—Won by Grunsky (C.) Gannier (Stars) second, Lamport (Stars) third; time, 24¾.

Burning broad jump—Won by H. Lamport (Stars.) Nichols (C.) second, Jackson (C.) third; distance, 22ft. 5in.

Pole vault—Nichols (C.) and Maurer (Stars) tied for first place, Watkins (Stars) third; height, 11ft. 6in.

Discus—Won by Manly (C.) Richardson (C.) second, Johnson (C.) third; distance, 115ft. ¾.

Discus and javelin scores not counted in meet through lack of entrants from southern contingent. No relay race was run for the same reason, the southern Stars not having a full team.
