

TROJANS ELOPE WITH HONORS IN A.A.U. MEET.

Occidental Comes Through with a Strange Burst of Speed and Winds up Ahead of Pomona — Norwood Takes Everything in Sprints — Crippen Runs a Great Race in Two-mile Event.

STRANGE things occurred at the A.A.U. track and field meet yesterday afternoon. The University of Southern California won the affair over the heads of Occidental, Pomona and the L.A.A.C. with a score of 56 points. And stranger still, and almost beyond belief, Occidental defeated Pomona with a bevy of points to spare. This is a wild life these days and almost anything is apt to happen.

RESULTS.

Scorekeeper Julius Rufus Klawans worked himself into a fever over the results, but finally offered the following: University of Southern California, 56; Los Angeles Athletic Club, 52; Occidental, 25; Pomona, 22; Whittier, 13; Polytechnic, 8; Santa Monica, 2; Redlands, 2; Harvard, 1; Whittier State School, 1, and Los Angeles Athletic Club Juniors, 1.

One thing was conclusively demonstrated by the entertainment yesterday, namely, that all track and field meets should contain the mile walk somewhere on the programme. This event was far and away the feature of the A.A.U. bill, despite the high-class work of Adkinson, Norwood, King, Kelly, Murray, Crippen and others.

K. Nippe, C. Foster and H. Thomson were the comedy stars in the long-distance walk. K. Nippe won and easily took the cake. He deserves a half-acre lot in the hall of fame. An Orpheum road show couldn't remain on the same circuit with this howling expert.

EXCITING.

When the walk started, those in the grand stand who weren't educated up to this event, thought they were witnessing an exhibition of Honolulu hula dancing. Nippe and Foster tripped through some preliminary steps and then lit out down the course. The entire audience rolled under the benches and expired. And for five strenuous laps these gents kept their speedy walk up. Foster was ahead most of the time. But on the last lap Nippe came through with a blood-curdling burst of speed and smashed through the tape first.

The sprints were exceptionally good and the slow time must be

blamed on the condition of the course. In the hundred-yard dash Norwood of Occidental demonstrated his true worth and ability by wallowing such notables as Cheney of Pomona, Murray of Whittier and Lampport of U.S.C. At the tape Norwood was comfortably in the lead and the other demons were badly bunched. The judges had to draw straws to determine the lower places.
