Relay Race is Taken by High School in Fast Time in the Joint Meet

The sensation of the meet was the relay which was won by the local team in the fast time of one minute and 34-2-5 seconds. It is said by the U. S. C. coach that the local relay team is the fastest he has seen for some time. McDonald in the first lap lost a shoe but beat his man to the tape. The relay team composed of McDonald, Coombs, Inghram and Cook will be greatly respected in the All Southern as they are known to be fast.

The final count however was 78 to 34 in favor of the U. S. C. The races were all fast and the distances good despite the wind. Draper was not able to enter the high jump but it is expected that he will be ready for the All Southern which will mean some points in that event for the local school. Lucas and Evans starred for the varsity team. Following is the way they scored:

Discus—Evans (USC), Pitts (SB), and Raab (USC); distance 116 feet.

Shot put—Evans (USC), Lucas (USC), and Townsend (USC); distance 44 ft. 11 in.

220 low hurdles—Gansner (USC), McDonald (SB), and Raab (USC); time 24-4-5 sec.

Broad jump—Evans (USC), Lucas (USC) and Warren (USC); distance 20 ft. 3 in.

Mile run—George (USC), Kinney (SB) and Coughlin (SB); time 5 min, 11 sec.

Relay won by San Bernardino. McDonald, Coombs, Inghram and Cook; time 1 min, 34-2-5 sec.

180 yard run—George (USC), and Kinney (SB), no third; time 2 min 13 sec.

100 yard dash—Cook (SB), Perry (USC) and Lucas (USC); time 10:02.

440 yard run—Lucas (USC), McDonald (SB) and George (USC); time 53-3-5 sec.

220 yard dash—Perry (USC), Cook (SB), and Inghram (SB); time 22-4-5 sec.

120 yard high hurdles—Gansner (USC), Townsend (USC) and Gerhart (SB); time 15-1-5 sec.

Pole vault—Raab (USC) and Maurer (USC) tied for first; Alvarado (SB) third; height 10 ft. 6 in.

High jump—Evans (USC) first, and Brimmer (SB) and Raab (USC) tied for second and third; height 5 ft 3 in.

Although the locals were defeated in the hurdles they were glad to see their old friend George Gansner, who is a product of the local high school, do so well in that event. Gansner was taught his first experience in hurdling by Coach Johnson at the old high school where he graduated before going to U. S. C. He is now one of the best hurdlers in the south.
