

TROJANS TAKE ANNUAL MEET.

A.A.U. Events Staged Amid Dust and Wind.

Kilby-Adkinson Duel Fizzles into Oblivion.

Many Old-timers Prove to be Still on Deck.

Drenched in dust and dodging miniature whirlwinds that bore with them everything from shredded real estate to waddering lamp posts and telephone poles, 200 dauntless fans clung to the swaying bleachers at Hayward Field yesterday afternoon through the entire A.A.U. track programme. When the relay had been properly solemnized and the shivering athletes were scorching toward their lockers, the gallant 200 pried its lunch boxes loose from the weather-beaten stands and hied for home, cold, hungry, semi-exhausted, but radiant with the satisfaction of having dutifully completed their arduous vigil and proved an undying devotion to amateur athletics.

Although the scorer's roost was rocking violently in the breeze that intrepid person managed to post the following final totals before daylight gave out: U.S.C. 26, Redlands 24, Pomona College 17, L.A. A.C. 17, Occidental 11, Pasadena High 10, Naval Reserve 8, Chaffee Union High 7, San Bernardino High 6, Poly 6, Throop 4, Harvard 3 and L.A. High 2.

FEATURELESS.

Wind, dust and a slow track prevented the annihilation of records and the bursts of speed which set one's spine a-shiver. The efficiently heralded duel between Kilby of Redlands and Adkinson of Pomona in the 440 failed to materialize for the simple and sufficient reason that Mr. Adkinson decided not to run. After ducking through a half-mile in the clipping time of 1 minute 57 1-5 seconds in a futile attempt at a record Adkinson declared that he was through with the cinder game forever and no amount of mellifluous entreaty from coach, team-mates or spectators could induce him to settle into his marks beside Kilby for the one-lap dash.

Methusalem Murray, our old reliable hurdler, hunted up his spiked boots and cleared the sticks in 15 2-5 seconds, just to demonstrate that he is able to shake a leg once in a while. Gansmer of U.S.C. rambled over the low barriers in advance of the now-famous Kilby, but was forced to content himself with a rapid rear view of Murray in the 120-yard festivities.

NO RECORD.

Ungraded by sharp competition and running on a short curve track Kilby disappointed his following in the 440 by taking 51 1-5 seconds for the distance. Secure in the possession of his 43-second mark in the conference meet, Kilby crawled into a bathrobe to watch his co-conspirator, Yount, push the Redlands cause into second position by winning the broad jump and sniping sundry second and third places in several other events.

Clarence Bean and Pete Bagnard of the L.A.A.C. completed the list of ancient heroes who leapt back into the spotlight for the brief space of an afternoon. Bean squirmed over the bar in the pole vault at twelve feet, the best height on record here this season, while Bagnard, by dint of much massaging of his mighty right arm, heaved a third in the discus. Bagnard, who has lost about ninety-nine pounds since embarking on the sea of matrimony, wound up his antics by losing two \$10 bills which were frantically searched for by the entire crowd. Pete did not recover the green boys and is afraid that he will have to reduce still more.
