

# RECORD LIST OF ENTRIES.

**Claremont Track Meet Promises to be Successful.**

**All Southland Colleges to be Represented.**

**Most of the High Schools Also to Take Part.**

With close to 250 names of the official roster, the predictions of Bob Weaver and his co-workers concerning tomorrow's A.A.U. track and field meet at Claremont have been verified by the facts. A record list of entries and a wider representation of institutions was the advance prophecy and it has been made true.

All of the Southern California colleges and most of the high schools of this part of the State will be represented. What particularly delights the officials is the abundance of entrants from such outlying schools as San Bernardino, Fullerton, Orange, Citrus Union, Pomona, and Redlands high schools, and the return to action of Sherman Institute after an absence of five or six years.

Every race on the bill-of-fare promises to give the spectators their full value. The high school 100-yard dash will open the meet with such stars as Hawkins of Fullerton, clocked at 10 seconds, several times, fighting with Von Huddleston of Lincoln and a dozen other fast steppers.

The open 100-yard event includes Verl Murray of Whittier, Charley Paddock of U.S.C., Chaney of Pomona and Cook of Redlands as the headliners. Murray will reappear in the hurdles pitted against George Gansner, the Trojan timber-topper and a field of other hopefuls.

In the mile trip Marvin of Lincoln, winner of the city meet, and Dean, the Throop conference victor, will battle it out. The two-mile will see some of the Sherman Indians at their favorite pastime. Ponsell, who won the distance event at San Diego in 1916, will run under the institute colors.

The pole vault looks like a specialty number for the L.A.A.C., with Bean, Giffen, "Bo" Wilson and Frank Greves performing for the Mercury. Greves recently returned from France but was regarded as one of the topnotchers during his prewar Stanford and club days.

Twenty candidates for discus honors are in the running with Pete Bagnard of the L.A.A.C., as one of the big favorites to win.

# ENTRIES FOR TRACK MEET.

## A.A.U. Event is Bound to Prove Real Classic.

## Generous Entries from Near- by Institutions.

## Paddock to Meet Chaney on Cinder Path.

Bob Weaver & Co. went into executive session at the L.A.A.C. last night on the subject of the entries for the A.A.U. track and field meet which will be held at Pomona College, Saturday, with the result that the complete line-up of contestants for the cinder classic is available for the dopesters. The entry list closed last night at 6 o'clock.

Generous entries by U.S.C., the L.A.A.C., the University of Redlands, Pomona College and the city high schools plus the additional entries of two, three and four-man teams, will fill the Claremont stadium to capacity. And every track star of any magnitude has his name on the entry roll, insuring the fans the best there is in competition.

For example, Charley Paddock of U.S.C., is billed to meet Chaney, the Pomona College speedster, over the century course. Paddock needs no introduction; Chaney has stepped the distance in ten seconds consistently in practice. The Sagehen rooters figure the latter may be able to shade this time sufficiently to defeat the Trojan sprinter. Von Huddleston of Lincoln and Cook of Redlands, high-class performers both, will add brilliance to this event.

The 440-yard dash is another race of promise judged by the entries. Three men who have stepped around the course in less than 50 seconds will battle it out. Kilby of Redlands, Schiller of U.S.C. and Wilcox, the Harvard Military Academy phenom, are the young men who will furnish the thrills here.

Pete Bagnard, veteran weight and discus man, is once again among those present and is considered a probable winner in the latter event.

The L.A.A.C. threatens to grab a whole sock of points in the pole vault unless Chapman of U.S.C. can break up the "Bo" Wilson, Clarence Bean and "Babe" Giffen combination. All three of the Mercury athletes are capable of twelve feet and slightly better.

"Bo" Wilson will not content himself with his pole vault activities. Back in his Oxy Michigan days, he was a world-beater in the high variety of hurdles and he has been limbering up in this event with the idea of pushing Verle Murray of Whittier and the other timber-toppers to the limit.
