

TRACK TEAMS WILL CLASH.

Stanford and the University of Southern California to Meet.

Stanford University's track team and its relative strength will be subjected to the acid-test Saturday afternoon. The Palo Alto boys will clash with Coach Dean Cromwell's hopes on Bovard field. This will mark the first local appearance of a northern track varsity this year.

Just how strong the Cardinal team is nobody knows, while the Trojan varsity is said to be strong and equally balanced as far as point grabbing is concerned. The northern boys have been laboring under a handicap this season due to the fact that no coach was provided for them.

Under the supervision of Captain "Cracky" Teitsworth and "Reg" Caughey, the "farm" tracksters have been working faithfully with the fond hope of duplicating its win of last year over the University of California.

It was reported that the Cardinal varsity would arrive here this morning on the "Lark," but word was received by Henry Bruce, manager of athletics at the University of Southern California that the team would not be here until Saturday and no meet will be held between Stanford and Pomona College.

Twenty men will probably make the trip. Of the runners who will do their share toward getting points for the visitors, "Ken" Lilly will probably be the largest point winner. Lilly is a Senior and has made his "S" in baseball, basketball, football and track. On the track he is the fastest sprinter in the University. His best time is 10 seconds flat for the century. If he can duplicate this performance he will be able to breeze in ahead of the speedy Charlie Paddock of the Trojan institution.

In the quarter mile, Maynard is the Cardinal's best hope. Last year in the big meet against Berkeley, Maynard succeeded in lowering the colors of Captain Moody of the Bears, who up to that time had been looked upon by his college mates as being invincible. While his time for the gruelling event was not record breaking it was commendable.

One of the most exciting quarter mile speed events seen on a local track in some time is in the making Saturday, for George Schiller of U. S. C. has been stepping over the distance in exceptionally good time. In meeting Maynard, the Southerner will have to run his level best to nose out the Cardinal "flier."

Captain Teitsworth will be seen in the half and mile. The Cardinal's best time for the half mile is 2 minutes and 1 second. Besides Captain Teitsworth, Westwick and Wilkie will also be seen in both of these long distance events, while

the Trojans will be represented by Wilson, Graham and Raab, Lewis George and Harrison.

Old reliable "Reg" Caughey, who has won first place in the shot for Stanford for the last two years against the Bruins, will heave the leaden pill out at Bovard Field Saturday for the edification of the southern boys, who appear to be a bit weak in the weight events. Metcalf will help Caughey in the Samsonian events.

As for the University of Southern California varsity men, their previous performances are sufficient to insure plenty of competition for the visitors. Saturday's contest promises to be an interesting affair and both teams will have good-sized rooting sections.
