STANFORD TRIMS U.S.C.

By winning first place and tying for third in the high jump, the Stanford track team succeeded in nosing out the University of Southern California squad yesterday afternoon on Boyard Field. The final score was: Stanford, 55%; U.S.C., 48%.

Only one event, exclusive of the usually exciting relay, gave the gallery of rooters a real run for their money. In the quarter-mile run, George Schiller of the Trojans ran the race of his life, nosing out the speedy Cardinal duo composed of Dinkelspeil and Bob Pelouze. The time was 51s. flat and was the most interesting bit of competition of the entire meet.

At the crack of the starter's pistol the Trojan fiyer took the lead and not once during the race was he headed. On the last lap Dinkenspell of Stanford started a sprint that for a time looked as though the plucky U.S.C. runner would be overtaken, but in the last ten yards the Falo Altoan began to weaken and Schiller was able to stumble across the line a bare foot ahead of the northern runner.

Charley Paddock was going "great guns" yesterday and showed his heels to the northern boys in both the century and the furlong. Paddock broke the tape a good ten feet ahead of Dinkelspeil, with "Ken" Lilly, he of Rugby and boxing fame, a close third. The watches caught Paddock at 10%s. Again, in s

the 220-yard event, Paddock dug his spikes far into the much-trodden Bovard cinder path, getting away to a good lead. By the time he had started to round the curve he was twenty feet or more ahead of the nearest Cardinal sprinter. He was; therefore, able to casually loaf across the finish.

Stanford finished strong in both of the long-grind events. In the half-mile run Carlsmith and Teitsworth finished first and second, respectively, while third went to Glenn Wilson. Both Teitsworth and Westwick of Stanford copped first and second places in the mile.
