

TROJANS COP MOST EVENTS.

Big Relay Carnival Finds Number of Colleges in Winning Line.

The University of Southern California's track representatives ran away with the big part of the show in the annual A.A.U. relay carnival. The Cardinal and Gold four-man team dashed off the one-mile race in 3m. 27½s., just one and one-fifth seconds slower than the Southern California record held by Pomona College, and entering two teams in the eight-man two-mile relay, the Trojans finished first and third.

Of the four open events on the programme, U.S.C. men grabbed all three places in the 100-yard dash, Charley Paddock winning in 10s. flat; second and third in the pole vault, and went unplaced in the high jump and high hurdles.

REDLANDS THERE.

Redlands busted into the limelight when the Baptist four-man combination distanced all rivals in the two-mile relay race. Time, 8m. 22½s. Colon Kilby, the quarter-mile record holder of the south, ran the last lap in 2m. 4s., as did the third man—Sawyer.

"Wild Bill" Yount of Redlands showed his heels to Murray of the L.A.A.C. and Dags of Pomona, in the 129-yard high hurdles. He finished three yards to the good, in 15½s., but might have been pressed harder had not Murray been slowed down when he hit the sixth hurdle.

OUTCLASSES FIELD.

The big feature of the day was the high jumping feat of a lad named Corey from Chaffee High School. His was a last minute entry. He outclassed the combined field of college and high school jumpers with a leap of 6ft. 1in.

All the honors in this event went to the prep school lads, the chaps from the higher temples of learning being hopelessly distanced. Drake of Los Angeles High took second with 5ft. 11in., followed by Bennet of Santa Paula, who cleared 5ft. 9in. The best such collegians as "Swede" Evans, the bulky gentlemen who plays on the Trojans' football team; George Bushmeyer, also of U.S.C.; Walker and Alder of Occidental and Voorhies and Denebrink of Pomona could do was somewhere in the neighborhood of 5ft. 6in.

BY LEAN MAN.

A lean gentleman by the name of Charley Borgstrom covered himself with glory and sawdust by taking first in the pole vault after a prolonged battle with youthful Dick Emmons, recently of Manual, and Joe Chapman of U.S.C. The former Trojan star now wears long wavy locks and looks more like a poet than an athlete.

Martin, an Occidental midget, who has never done better than 16ft. 6in. in his life, endeared himself to the hearts of the Tiger rooters and Coach Stanton by floating over 11ft. 6in. Soon afterward he was observed doing a flip flop in mid air when his pole snapped under him, but luckily came to no grief.

WERE INTERESTING.

The college relay races were all interesting, but the competition invariably petered out on the last lap, the winners snapping the tape anywhere from fifteen to seventy-five yards to the good of his nearest

competitor. Charley Paddock finished with the greatest lead in the eight-man, two-mile relay race. Occidental College drifted into second place here because Wallace, the seventh Pomona College runner pulled a tendon on his lap.

But if competition was not keen in the college races it was particularly enlivening in the high school two-mile relay race for four men. Here the Los Angeles High, Hollywood and Manual Arts runners were bunched up to 200 yards from the tape on the last lap. Holcomb, running the last half for Los Angeles High, let out a kink at this stage of the proceedings, and finished fifteen yards to the good. His lap was made in 2m. 6s., according to the unofficial timers. The fight for second in this event was terrific, Chase of Hollywood snatching the place from A. Scovall by inches in a desperate finish.
