

PADDOCK TIES WORLD RECORD.

Shows Terrific Speed in Bear-Trojan Track Meet.

Three Watches Catch Him at 9 3-5 Seconds.

California Wins Affair by a Wide Margin.

(EXCLUSIVE DISPATCH.)

BERKELEY, April 10.—The world's record for the 100-yard dash was equaled here today by Paddock of the University of Southern California in a meet against the University of California, the time being 9 3/5 s., the same as that made by D. J. Kelly.

Paddock's time in the 100-yard dash was said by meet officials to be unofficial. Five stop watches were used, three registering 9 3/5 s. and two 9 4/5 s.

Paddock came within 1/4 of a second of the world's record in the 220-yard dash, finishing in 21 2-5 s.

Merchant of California finished second, and Isenhour of Southern California, third.

NONE ENTERED.

The University of Southern California had no men entered in the pole vault, 120 yards high hurdle and high jump.

The 100-yard dash was first run by Arthur Duffy in 9 3/5 s., Berkeley Oval, New York, May 31, 1902. Duffy was afterward proved to be a professional and all his records were expunged from the books.

death was announced yesterday, ran the century in the same time at the Pacific Northwest Association meet at Spokane on June 23, 1906. Kelly's record was allowed by the amateur officials, though it was claimed he ran with the wind at his back.

Arthur S. Robinson was credited with the same performance at Philadelphia, May 2, 1913; C. H. Patching, at London, June 22, 1912, and Howard P. Drew, the famous Southern California athlete, with making the time on two occasions, once at Hartford, Ct., September 1, 1913, and at Berkeley, this State, March 23, 1914.
