## *Great Interest Prevails in Redlands-U. of S. C. Field Meet Saturday.*

Great interest prevails in the meeting between the one-mile four-man relay teams of Redlands University and the University of Southern California on Paddock Field, Pasadena, next Saturday. If a new Southern California record isn't hung up by the winner the fans are going to be terribly annoyed and a new Pacific Coast record is quite within the realm of possibility.

Last year the Redlands outfit, composed of Zediker, Lloyd Yount, Bill Yount and Kilby, averaged pretty close to 51 seconds to the man and it is understood that this year Zediker, who was the slow member last year, has chewed down his mark about a second.

According to the Trojan rooters the Baptists can't cut much ice unless they can ramble around 3 minutes 22 seconds. Schiller, with a record of 48 4-5, Wilson, with a mark of 49 4-5 and Bill Isenhour and Eddie Leahy both apparently capable of very close to 50 seconds will make a horribly hard aggregation to beat.

The open 100-yard dash will bring together Charley Paddock, who is not likely to lose his championship, and Bill Isenhour of U.S.C., Spangler and Argue of Occidental, Yount of Redlands and Stoddard of southern branch, with a possibility of Benny Arnold of Pomona. This is a classy field and will make the running for second place very exciting.

The open high jump and polevault events will likewise attract a lot of nifty performers as will the 120-yard hurdles in which Yount of Redlands, Daggs of Pomona, Anderson of Pomona High and Rogers of U.S.C. will mingle. The track is said to be very fast and quite a few very fast performances are expected not only in the aforementioned events, but likewise in the high school relay races.
