

# OUCH! TROJANS TREATED ROUGH

*Tiger Peagreen Track Squad  
Tramples on Them.*

*Massive Score Rolled Up in  
Comfortable Style.*

*Capt. Cliff Argue of Oxy is  
Real Fireworks.*

By the massive score of 32 to 21 the Occidental freshmen yesterday massacred the U.S.C. peagreens at Boyard Field. This entitles the Occidental rosters to a fine large gloat. The Tigers are a bit out of practice at gloating, but make up in long-suppressed enthusiasm, what they lack in finesse.

ALL 'ROUND CHAMP.

Capt. Cliff Argue of Occidental was the all-round champion of the afternoon, with a total of 21 points, while Weaver of U.S.C. ran second with a total of 12, secured in the weights. Johnny Powers and Skeeter Hine of Occidental were among the missing, while Coach Cromwell of U.S.C. displayed an imposing list of eight promising point winners, who were absent either through illness or facultyitis. When the teams meet in a return affair at Occidental on the 25th, Cromwell hopes to have his men all in shape.

Johnny Spangler and Cliff Argue, Occidental's human motorcycles, were in rare form and galloped up and down the cinders, gathering in points with grace and ease. Although the weather was better for ski-jumping or sleigh-riding than for a track meet and the Trojan track is not noted for its speed, the performances in the running races were rather good.

NOT SO BAD.

Spangler took first in the 100 in 19 1-8 and loafed around the quarter in 53 4-8. Argue took second in the century and galloped the furlong in 23 4-8. He also won the high jump and broad jump and took a second in the shot. Ellsworth and Baker had a terrible struggle for second in the quarter and for first in the half, Ellsworth winning the longer race in 2:09 flat. Chandler of Occidental skated around the mile in 4m. 52 3-8s.

A young man named Wheeler, for U.S.C., came close to being a hero by taking second place in both hurdle events and nailing a third in the high jump. Unfortunately in the high hurdles he couldn't refrain from knocking the obstacles over and was disqualified. Ridderhoff took the low hurdles in fairly easy fashion and in fair time, while McCook struggled over the high sticks into first place.

HOPES TO IMPROVE.

Owing to the absence of numerous stars, U.S.C. forfeited the pole vault and the relay. In the return meet on the Tiger track, Coach Cromwell expects to have, in addition to those who competed yesterday, Dick Emmons in the pole and high jump, Neil Raney and Eddie Purtell in the dashes, Thatcher Taylor in the hurdles and jumps and shot, broad jumpers named Wilbur Allen and Welch and Phil Tiernan in the low hurdles. With this aggregation eligible and in condition, he expects to give the all-conquering Tigers a terrible run. The summary:
