MHARLIE PADDOCK PROVES I IT WASN'T AN ACCIDENT.

Comes Right Back and Gives World Records Another Crack in the Stanford Track Meet.

STANFORD UNIVERSITY, March 29 .- Another successful attack on the existing International Amateur Athletic Federation world record of 21 1-5 seconds in the 220-yard dash was made here today by Charles W. Paddock, University of Southern California, when, running against Stanford University, he made the distance in 21 seconds. Saturday, at Berkeley, Paddock ran the event in 20 4-5 seconds, but his record has not yet been allowed.

Paddock today also repeated his feat of Saturday in running the 100-yard dash in 9 3-5 seconds, the world record. Although Paddock took both his races and U.S.C. captured eight first places out of fifteen, Stanford won the meet, 75-56.

caught Paddock in the 220-yard dash at 20 3-5 seconds and three registered 21 seconds flat. Dr. Frank Angell, head timer, said that if Saturday's mark is not allowed today's record should be, for there was no wind to help the runner.

Morris Kirksey, Stanford, was but a foot behind Paddock in the 100-yard event. Kirksey and Paddock have been running each other for two years, at the Antwerp Olympic Games, at Los Angeles, at Stanford and at other places, and Kirksey never has won.

A new electric timing device, used to supplement the watches today, registered Paddock in the 100-yard run at 9.93s. and in the 220 at 21.248.

The southern team was not en-tered in the two-mile run and the high jump. Five of the men en-tered today, Paddock, Schilter and Evans of U.S.C., and Kirksey and Hanner of Stanford, competed in the 1920 Olympic Games at Antwerp. Summary:
