

# TROJAN ATHLETES WIN A.A.U. RELAY CARNIVAL,

*Lincoln High School Carries Off  
Second Honors, Oxy Finishes  
Third at Redlands.*

REDLANDS, Feb. 18.—Southern California's cinderpath season received a hilarious welcome when it was ushered in with the A.A.U. relay carnival here today. U.S.C.'s rooters were perhaps the most hilarious, due to the fact that the Trojan wizards hustled off with enough blue ribbons to put the affair on ice, totaling thirty-six points.

## MANY UPSETS RECORDED.

A number of upsets featured the doings, the most spectacular of which was U.S.C.'s unexpected victory over Occidental in the four-man mile relay. The Tigers started off with a flourish, Buckman grabbing the pole and gaining a substantial lead. Gary and Powers added a little to Oxy's margin and when Tony Spangler took the baton the fans thought things were settled. Young George Schiller stepped to the front here, picking up on the Tiger marvel a little with every stride and nosing out Spangler a short inch at the finish.

Buckman of Occidental dashed in first in the open 100-yard affair covering the distance in 10 1-5s. Schiller, Argue and Crissman followed in the order named.

### RAILSPLITTERS TAKE JUMP.

Lincoln got the jump on the rest of the high schools with the first event on the program, taking first, second, third and fourth in the class 1, 100-yard dash. Stapler, Norman, La Verne and Briggs pulled this little stunt for the Railsplitters.

Polytechnic walked away from everybody in the four-man, two-mile event while Coverley of Hollywood thrilled the bleachers by sprinting past Young of Los Angeles High in the last lap of the class 1, four-man mile.

Charley Paddock failed to appear, although the U.S.C. team didn't seem to need him very badly.
