

TROJANS EXCEL ON CINDERPATH.

*Kick the Redlands Bulldog
Around in Dual Meet.*

*Final Score Favors U.S.C. by
Juicy Margin.*

*Schiller Ties Bob Allen in
Furlong Sprint.*

Dean Cromwell and his cinder-path cohorts spoiled a perfectly good afternoon for Redlands yesterday at Bovard Field by trimming the Bulldogs in their first dual meet of the season by a margin of some twenty-three points. The final score tipped in U.S.C.'s favor, 72 2-3 to 49 1-8.

Redlands made a valiant attempt to trample on the Trojans, and succeeded in taking a good portion of first places, but a flock of second and third places, in addition to a good list of blue ribbons, salted down the affair for the locals.

WILD EVENT.

Spec Schiller proved the biggest thrill of the afternoon by helping Bob Allen of Redlands bust the tape in the 220. Allen was doped to win the furlong easily, but the best he could do was to finish in a dead heat with the U.S.C. marvel in 23s. flat.

However, Allen ran true to form in the 100-yard event, taking first honors in the amazing time of 10s. flat. Schiller followed him, and Raney hustled in third. Blalock, who was expected to give Allen a run for his change in the century sprint, was called away on urgent

business, having struck oil or something in his back yard.

Waterman stepped off a fast half-mile in behalf of U.S.C., finishing twenty yards ahead of Troyer in 2m. 6s. Troyer managed to nose Patton out of second place by a matter of inches.

Redlands took most of the points in the distances, while U.S.C. scored heavily in the weights. All the field events were won by the Trojans, Dick Emmons taking the pole vault, high jump, and second in broad jump. Cap Rogers proved that he is still partly alive by winning the low hurdles, and doing it in 27s.

The relay went to Redlands.
