

TROJAN FROSH SAVE THE DAY

*Win Majority of Points for
U.S.C. Squad*

*L.A.A.C. Second in Number
of Digits*

*Occidental Athletes Grab
Third Honors*

Aided and abetted by a gang of freshmen who scored more points than the varsity, the University of Southern California yesterday won the track and field championship of Southern California on the Occidental College oval with the Los Angeles Athletic Club second and Occidental third.

Following are the scores: U.S.C., 68; L.A.A.C., 39; Occidental, 36½; Pomona, 18; Unattached, 11; Oxnard High, 8; S.B.U.C., 7; Lincoln High, 5; Redlands, 3½; Huntington Beach High, 3; Harvard Military, 2; Hollywood High, 2; Riverside Poly, 2; Whittier, 1; Manual Arts, 1; Inglewood, 1.

There probably never was a track meet held under worse conditions than prevailed yesterday, a wind that actually approached a gale sweeping across the field and preventing good performances except in the pole vault, low hurdles, 220-yard dash and javelin throw which were all held with the wind.

HIGH MAN

Grandpa Alma Richards, who was a college star ten years ago and in 1913 won the Olympic high jump at Stockholm, was the big noise of the day with a total of 18 points. He won the high jump, discus and 56-pound weight, took third in the shot and fourth in the hammer.

Otto Anderson, Trojan freshman star, was second largest winner with 15 points, the result of first in both hurdles, second in the broad jump and third in the hop, step and jump. Anderson was in fine form yesterday and the crowd was greatly disappointed at the inability of Charlie Daggs of Pomona and Peg Murray of the L.A.A.C. to compete on the barrier events with the Trojan star.

George Schiller of U.S.C. and Cliff Argue of Occidental won two first places each. Schiller in the 220 and 440 and Argue in the 100 and the broad jump. Schiller also ran his customary high-powered lap on the Trojan winning relay team. Argue's showing was something of a surprise as he was injured in some kind of a rah-rah rumpus the day he returned from the northern trip and hadn't had a suit on since the Stanford meet.

Henry Stapler, late of Lincoln, gave Argue a thrill in the century and led Schiller for a while in the furlong. Johnny Powers of Occidental led the field in the quarter until the home stretch, where Schiller passed him and Payne of Pomona just nipped him at the tape. Stroud of Pomona won the half fairly easily, while Ellsworth of Occidental, Smith of the L.A.A.C. and Martin of Occidental had a terrible battle for the other points.

EXCITING

The two relays were thrillers. In the half mile high school event some young man from Santa Ana got off to a great lead but one of Lincoln's dusky demons took the lead on the second lap. A long thin person from L. A. High ran away from the field on the third lap and Field Thompson of the Pioneers held his lead nicely. Meanwhile both Pasadena and Santa Ana runners nosed out Norman of Lincoln, who faded badly at the finish.

The open mile relay found one U.S.C. team composed of three freshmen and George Schiller, and two Occidental teams. The Tigers led on the first lap but the Trojans got ahead on the second round. The third Trojan runner lost about 5 yards and set Schiller off about four yards in front of Powers of Occidental. Powers did his darndest and ran a better race than he did in the quarter but couldn't catch the flying Trojan.
