

# SOUTHERNERS CAPTURE RELAY

## Padlock Paves Way for Win in Final Event

## Slow Track Hinders Athletes Seeking Records

## Cardinal Trackmen Triumph by 72 to 57

PALO ALTO, April 3.—Stanford University's track athletes helped their coach, "Dick" Templeton, celebrate the arrival of a baby girl here today by defeating the University of Southern California track squad, 72 to 57. The local track was very slow because of the recent rains and only two really sensational times were turned in, being Otto Anderson's 15.2-5a. in the high hurdles and Frank Mayer's 2. 2-5 in the two-mile.

### CROWWELL PULLS SURPRISE

Coach Dean Crowwell pulled a surprise in the relay when he sent Charley Padlock in to run the first lap. Padlock was paired with Sherman and the two finished almost neck and neck, with the Trojan Eyer slightly in the lead. Ivan Johnson took the baton from Padlock, while Schofield continued for the Cards. Johnson gave Aden Hughes a four-yard lead which Van Judah of Stanford overcame, handing Williamson a three-yard lead on the last lap. However, Tale Marts, running fourth for the Southerners, plodded in Williamson's tracks until the stretch, when he lit out and broke the tape with a good seven yards to spare. The time, 3:23 4-4, was excellent considering the slowness of the track.

Getting back to Padlock, however, the world's fastest human was all through when he finished his lap. Still Charley had a right to be "tagged" because topping off a 100 and a 200 with a quarter-mile dash never did make anybody feel like taunting Jack Dempsey. Then again it was Padlock's first 440 in competition and it more than likely will be his last.

### OTTO POINT STAR

Otto Anderson was once more high point man for U.S.C., winning the high and low hurdles, the broad jump and taking second in the 100-yard dash. Otto stepped over the high sticks in 15 1/2a., his best time this season, clocked off a 24.2 low-hurdle race and capped the broad jump with a leap of 22ft.

Norman Anderson, with first in both weight events, and Charley Padlock, with victories in the century and furlong, were second on the U.S.C. list at point-collecting. Marts did not take as many points, but his win in the 440 and his final lap in the relay were impressive. Right now Marts could take on any quarter-miler on the Coast and trim him. The Trojan 440 ace is just right and he has enough stamina to thoroughly wear out most athletes. If Marts improves much more in his remaining two years at U.S.C., he is very liable to uncrack a quarter right around the hat.

Woods picked up an unexpected point in the mile run when Elliot pulled a tendon while engaged in a sprint with Gurley on the last lap. Elliot had to drop out and Woods breezed into third place. Rantz also ran a strong half-mile, being voted out of third place by about a foot. White came through in the pole vault, taking second from Schofield.

### ROGERS IS THE GOODS

Old Cap. Rogers also looked very much like the goods, picking off four perfectly good points for his alma mater by leaping to second place in the broad jump and snagging a third in the low hurdles. The Trojans leave tonight for Los Angeles, where they will rest for about a week and prepare for their meet with the University of Arizona at Tucson on April 14.
