Lillian Copeland Breaks Three American Records in Track Meet at Philadelphia

PHILADELPHIA, July 9. (AP)—Lillian Copeland of the Pasadena Athletic and Country Club, broke three American records today in the trial events of the women's A.A.U. track-and-field championships at the Sesquicentennial stadium. She broke the shotput, discus and javelin records. The Pasadena club led in qualifying entrants for the finals tomorrow, with Northern California second and Toronto Ladies' Club third.

The time was 51s., the same mark made by an all-Canadian team last year. It was the second heat of the event. In the first heat Pasadena Athletic and Country Club defeated Prudential of Newark, and Boston Swimming Association.

Two American records were equaled. Miss Betty Siska, Midway A. C., Chicago, negotiated the 50-yard dash in 6s., and Ellen Brough, unattached, stepped the 220-yard dash in 27 4-5s. in their qualifying heats.

Helen Filkey of Chicago created a new American record when she won her heat in the 60-yard hurdles in 8.4s. today. Miss Filkey erased the old mark of 8.8s., held jointly by Camella Sabie, New Jersey Normal School, and Hazel Kirk, Paterson, N. J.

MISS COPELAND BRINGS VICTORY

*Gains Three Firsts for Team
at Philadelphia*

*Helen Filkey Fails to Shine
as in 1925 Meet*

*Four Marks for Women

PHILADELPHIA, July 10. (AP)—Lillian Copeland of the Pasadena Athletic and Country Club, today defied

the rays of torrid sun and won three championships in the A.A. U. women's track and-field meet, enabling her home club to retain its team title, won last year.

In landing the three individual championships, Miss Copeland established three new American records. She put the eight-pound

shot 33ft. 3 3-4in.; tossed the javelin 112ft. 5 1-2in., and threw the discus 101ft. 1in. The discus record was established by her yesterday in the trials.

The former records were 106ft.

9 3-4 in., for the javelin; 36ft.

11 3-4 in., for the shot put, and

98ft. 2in., for the discus.

A fourth American women's record was shattered when Catherine Macguire of the Paterson, (N. J.) Recreation Center, leaped 4ft. 11 1-4in., in the high jump. The former record was 4ft. 10 7-8in., made by Katherin Lee, Chicago, 1923.

TAKE 26 POINTS

Through the uncanny ability of Miss Copeland to garner points, the Pasadena club won the team point trophy with 26 points. Midwest Athletic Club of Chicago was second with 24 points; Northern California Athletic Club, which was competing under protest, was third, 16 points; Toronto Ladies' Club, 13; Paterson Recreation Club, 10; Coliseum A. C., St. Louis, 8; Meadowbrook Club, Philadelphia, 4; Brooklyn Edison, Boston Swimming and Prudential A. C., Newark, N. J., 3 each; V. V. V. Girls' Club, Detroit, 2, and McGill University, 1.

Rosa M. Grosse of the Toronto Ladies' Club, won the 100-yard dash by defeating Miss Helen Filkey of the Midwest Athletic Club, Chicago, in the fast time of 11 8-10s. Miss Filkey, who was a star of the meet at Pasadena last year, was an easy victor in

The 440-yard relay race was won by the Toronto Ladies' Club. In negotiating the distance in 51s., it equaled the world record for the distance. The same quartet equaled the record in the trials yesterday. Pasadena Athletic Club was second and Northern California was third.

Frances Keddle of Northern California was the winner of the 220-yard dash. She defeated Ellen Brough of Paterson, N. J.; Ethel Nichols of Pasadena, and Edna Sayre of Brooklyn.
