Hollywood Sprinter Equals Indoor 75-Yard Mark

150-Meter Dash is Easily Won in 15.7 Seconds

Cinderpath Teams Work Out for National Contest

Borah, latest Southern California sprint phenom, set a world's outdoor 75-yard dash record of 7.6 seconds at the Coliseum yesterday afternoon. The mark ties the official indoor record of 7.6 seconds held jointly by five sprinters. The race is a freak event and there is no official world record for the distance.

Borah's performance was made all the more remarkable by the fact that he was exceptionally slow getting out of his holes, and was led for fifty yards of the distance by Hugh Pinney, Pomona College star, who is competing for the Los Angeles Athletic Club. The Trojan star literally flew over the track to catch the flying Pinney a few yards before the finish and beat him out by a bare two feet.

An attempt to break the 150-meter mark set by Charley Paddock on the same track some months ago failed by one-tenth of a second. Borah won easily in 15.7s. with no one to push him.

Borah's races were the feature of the track-and-field program, which was nothing more than a work-out for the athletes who will participate in the national championships at Philadelphia.

Bud Houser, national and world champion in the weights, went after a new record for the twelve-pound shot, but failed by several inches of establishing a new record. But tossed the pellet 56ft. 4 3-4in.

Bob Maxwell, Mercury star hurdler, who holds the Pacific Coast low-hurdle mark at 23.3s., won both hurdles easily. He topped the low barriers in 23.8s. and the highs in 15s. flat. Les Eades, Hollywood High School hurdler running for the Hollywood club, chased him in the high sticks.

The Smith brothers of San Diego finished one-two in the pole vault. Harry Smith won the event with a 13ft. leap, while Ralph tied with McDermott of the L.A.A.C. at 12ft. 6in. Both of the brothers are competing under the Mercury Club colors.

Harlow, Hollywood Athletic Club javelin-tosser, won the event with a great heave of 197ft. 6in. Eaton of the Mercury club was second with a throw of 188ft. 10in.

According to Tommy Davis, Jimmy Payne, the sensational 19-year-old low-hurdler from San Bernardino, is going to make the trip back East as a member of the Hollywood Athletic Club team. Payne holds the world prep record of 23.8s. and is expected to be quite an asset to the clubmen.
