

Dye Establishes New World Mark In Hurdle Race

Californian Better's Thom- son's Record — Wyckoff Defeats Paddock

Los Angeles, June 16.—(AP.)—Leighton Dye, running under the Los Angeles Athletic Club's colors established a new world's record for the 110 meters hurdles during the sectional Olympic tryouts here today. The former University of Southern California timber topper cleared the hurdles in 14 3-5 seconds, or two tenths of a second better than the mark set by E. J. Thomson, of Canada.

Frank Wyckoff, 19 years old Glendale sprinter, twice showed his heels to the incomparable Charles Paddock in feature races. Wyckoff led Paddock to the take by two yards in the 100 meter dash and broke the tape in the 200 meter event five yards ahead of the veteran of two Olympics.

Wyckoff equalled the world's record of 20 4-5 seconds for the 200 meters in beating out his illustrious rival.
