

STEWART STARS IN TRACK MEET

Texas Giant in Classy Form as U.S.C. Fresh Race

Labes Sparkles in Weights; Wins Shot Event

Darling Displays Fast Effort to Annex Furlong

Big Jim Stewart, the one-man track team from Texas, flashed all over Board Field yesterday afternoon, when

Coaches Dean Cromwell and Tommy Davis staged a track meet among the seeming millions of freshmen for the purpose of selecting a first-string squad. Stewart won the high jump and discus, and took second in the shot put and broad jump, winding up with a victory on the impromptu 220-yard dash for

weight men.

The afternoon was crammed with activity and surprisingly good marks for early season. Especially gratifying were the two weight events. Stewart won the discus with a toss of 131 feet 14 1-3 inches, with Frank Labes, the New York youth, right behind at 131 feet 6 1-2 inches. Taking an extra throw, Labes heaved the platter 136 feet 10 1-4 inches, the longest toss of his career.

Labes took first in the shot, tossing the twelve-pound ball 50 feet 3 1-4 inches, with Stewart right behind at 49 feet 9 1-4 inches. Labes was disappointed with his showing, as he had tossed the ball around 53 feet a few nights before.

This pair will go a long way toward filling Bud Houser's shoes next year.

The sprints were equally sensational. Paul Bergfeld surprised in the hundred to finish in front by a fair-sized margin in 10 2-10s. Bert Darling, despite a bad heel, displayed all kinds of form to win the furlong in 23 8-10s—sensational time considering it was Darling's first real race of the season, the poor condition of the track, and his bad heel. He also placed second in the century.

Ellsworth Patterson, ex-Poly miler, showed a nice effort in winning the half in 2m. 5s, while Duncan Power and Jimmy Payne walked home in the high and low hurdles respectively in good form. The results:
