

M'GEAGH WINS FOR PREP MEN

*Eddleson, Powers Gather
Two Firsts for U.S.C.*

*Athletic Club Team Gallops
in Today's Meet*

*Darling Shows Flashy Form
in Speedy Sprint*

The array of freshman track talent which is sporting the Green and White "1930" at U.S.C., romped to an

easy victory over Eddy Leahy's Polytechnic State prep champions in a Bovard Field meet yesterday afternoon. The final score was 92 to 30 in favor of the yearlings.

At that, Coaches Tommy Davis and Dean Cromwell did not send all of their stars into the affair. Jim Stewart, the one-man team from Texas;

Frank Labes, national shotput champion; Bill Hubbard, ditto in the pole vault; Lee Bestajain, crack sprinter, and others of lesser note did not appear in uniform.

Poly won two events. McGeagh, State champion in the 880 ran to a 2m. 7.8s. victory in the half-mile, and two Poly athletes tied for first in the high jump, in which no Trojans competed.

Duncan Powers and Harry Eddleson featured the meet with two victories each, although Bert Darling turned in a nice effort to win the 100-yard dash in 10.1s, on a sticky track. He did not compete in the 220, so Paul Borgfeld copped that event. Roland Renfro, the flash from Oregon, apparently is gradually getting into shape. He placed second to Darling in the century, and turned in a brilliant 220 in the eight-man mile relay.

This afternoon, weather permitting, Coach Cromwell will send his varsity athletes against the Hollywood Athletic Club squad. Some interesting duels are in prospect in several of the events.

Cliff Reynolds of the Trojans will face Leighton Dye, his ex-team-mate, and Jimmy Meeks, who recently ran .15s. flat, in the high hurdles. Percy Niersbach, Bud Houser, Ken Grumbles, and Otto Anderson, four other U.S.C. men are on the Hollywood team, and will battle Cromwell's present heroes. Yesterday's results:
