Crack Glendale Flyer Wins from U.S.C. Freshmen

Shows Up Varsity Runners in Quarter-Mile Relay

Faulty Baton Passing Damages Regulars; Fresh Wins

championship team appeared at Harvard Field yesterday, when the Glendale prep crack athletes galloped all over the arena to give the U.S.C. fresh some unexpected competition. The fresh won, the score being 72 1-4 to 34 3-4, but it was the remarkable demonstration of ability by the Dynamiters that contained the cheer.

Frank Wykoff, a slim-legged junior from the prep institution, sped to victories in both sprints, winning the 100 in 16.1a and the furlong in 28a. But on a track that was muddied considerably by the rain of the previous night. He won the century by the remarkable margin of some ten yards. Bert Darling, fresh runner, was close up, but suffered a cramped leg, and did not finish, leaving Strom, another Glendale speedster, in second place.

Not content with this exhibition of speed, Wykoff started out as lead-off man for a four-man quarter-mile team, racing Dean Crosswell's varsity as well as the fresh squad. The varsity won in 44a, but Wykoff led Capt. Ed House by a margin of five or six yards at the first 110 mark, Herschel Smith, running against McInnis, who is the slowest of the four Glendale sprinters, got into the lead, and Johnny Parsons and Charley Borch managed to hang on to it to the end. Strom wound up for the Dynamiters and gained no flesh. The Trojan, however, was running in the third lane while Strom had the pole.

The score of yesterday's meet was practically the same as that which ended the fresh-Polytechnic mix-up. However, Frank Labea, Jim Stewart, Bill Hubbard and Jimmy Payne, who were out of the Poly meet, got into yesterday's affair and piled up 20 points. Without their services, the result of the meet would have been a good deal closer.

Warren Woodruff won the mile for the fresh in the pleasant time of 4m. 32a, finishing strongly. Elsworth Patterson, regular miler, tried his hand at the 800, and after being boxed until the last turn, uncoiled a terrific sprint from sixth place to lose the verdict to Patrick of the Dynamiters by two inches.

STEWART SCORES

Stewart cleared six feet 10 in the high jump for the fresh, won the broad jump at twenty-one feet one and one-half inches, and placed second in the shot to tie Wykoff for high-point honors. Wykoff, in addition to winning both sprints, finished second in the broad jump.
