

# U.S.C. TRACK TEAM WINS

*"Swede" Leistner Equals Pacific Coast Record in High Hurdles with 14.6s Race*

Breaking all records for rapid-fire competition U.S.C. defeated the Olympic club track team in exactly 1 hour, 15 minutes at the Coliseum yesterday afternoon. The score was 883-4 to 421-4 in a meet which was featured by Huge "Swede" Leistner's sensational hurdling, Charley Borah's sprinting and the neigh of two or three Trojan dark horses.

Track fans who were annoyed by the long-drawn-out relay carnival at the Coliseum recently should have been thoroughly recompensed by the swiftness with which the program was run off yesterday. There was something doing every minute. There were no delays between events. One scarcely had time to write down the results of one race before the winners of the next event were announced.

It was a landslide for U.S.C., the Olympic Club athletes winning

## Stanford in Victory Over H.A.C. Squad

STANFORD UNIVERSITY, March 12. (AP)—Stanford opened its track season here today by defeating the Hollywood Athletic Club 86½ to 44½.

Emerson Spencer, Dink Templeton's "made-over" hurdler, was the sensation of the meet. He won the quarter-mile dash in 48 1-5 seconds, the fastest time ever made for this event on the Stanford track. Spencer came back in the half-mile relay. Running last for Stanford's team he picked up a lead of three yards and won the event.

only four first places. Two of these were accounted for by Leistner, former Stanford ace, whose hurdling was the more remarkable because it was so totally unexpected.

In winning the high hurdles Leistner won a neck-and-neck race with Cliff Reynolds and equaled Leighston Dye's Coast record time of 14 3-5a. The low barriers were a walkaway for Leistner in 23 4-5a. "Suede" has been out of college nearly two years, but he never approached either of these marks at Stanford, so it looks as if the bespectacled boy is taking on a new lease of life.

Second only to Leistner's hurdling was the sprinting of Borah and House. The curly-haired Trojan sophomore won both events, but House was right on his tail in each race. Their main competition was furnished by Barber, formerly of California. He was close in the hundred but trailed by three yards in the furlong. Borah was content with 10a flat in the shorter race, but his 21 2-5a at this time of the season is plenty fast for the 220.

#### COUPLE OF SURPRISES

There were a couple of surprises in the field events. Doelter, a U.S.C. senior, defeated the veteran Myyza of the Olympic Club in the javelin with a toss of 166 ft. 8 1/2 in., and Alaski finished ahead of Harranft, former world's champion, in the discus throw. The distance was 136 ft. 3 1/2 in.

Next to the high-hurdle race in which Leistner and Reynolds ran stride for stride until the last barrier and the ex-Stanfordite finished inches ahead, one of the best races of the day was the half-mile. Lovejoy, a U.S.C. senior, who hasn't enjoyed much notoriety the last two years because of the presence of Percy Nierbach, bounded into the limelight by beating George in a whale of a battle for the tape. George led around the last turn, forcing Lovejoy to run at his elbow, but the latter wore down his sophomore rival in the stretch. Incidentally, Adams, another Trojan hope, was within three yards of the winner. The time was 1m. 59 2-5a.

#### SAUERS IS VICTOR

The 440 also was close with Bauers of U.S.C., Fuller of the Olympic Club and Wallace of U.S.C. staging a great fight for first place. Fuller set the pace until the last 100 yards, when it appeared for a moment as if he would be passed by three Trojan runners. As Bauers went by him Fuller dug in and put on enough steam to keep Wallace in the rear. There was less than a yard separating each runner at the finish. The time was 50 2-5a.

Chester Urruh sent the Trojans off in the lead with his victory in the mile, and they were never headed. His time of 4m. 23 1-5a, came very close to wrecking Lester Heilman's U.S.C. mark of 4m. 29a. Heilman did not run the mile, but captured the eight-lap grid in 10m. 13 1-5a.

Reynolds did not equal his recent efforts in breaking the Brothers California mark in the broad jump and Jack Merchant of the Olympic Club won it with a leap of 22ft. 7 3-5in. Harranft got the only other first that Leistner and Merchant did not account with a win in the shot put at 43ft. 9 3-5in.
