Payne also won the lows, coast-

ing the distance in 25.2s.

Jim Stewart, the one-man track team, who recently was declared cut for the rest of the season with a bad knee, didn't bother to don a track suit or obey orders, and won the javelin throw, took second in the discus and third in the shot. Stewart never had thrown a javelin in high school but has been working out under Jannes Anderson, Trojan trainer. Yesterday the freshman threw the spear an approximate distance of 178 feet.
