SIXTEEN MAKE UP U.S.C. TEAM

*Track Athletes to be Given
Rousing Send-off*

*Stanford Still Favored to
Cop Big Meet*

*Dope on Easterners Shows
How Teams Shape Up*

There will be considerable hub-bub in the neighborhood of the Arcade Station this evening, for Dean Cromwell and sixteen U.S.C. track athletes are to be given one of those "rousing sendoffs" for which college student bodies are notorious. The Trojans are to take their departure for Philadelphia, where on Friday and Saturday they defend their laurels as intercollegiate track-and-field champions of these United States.

The blowoff is scheduled for 4:45 p.m., with the Trojan special pulling out fifteen minutes later. Several hundred enthusiastic supporters will undoubtedly be in attendance, and the cheers of the multitude are likely to ring in the boys' ears for several miles at least.

Cromwell's team includes Capt. Ed House, Charley Borah, Ed Lewis, Harold Lovejoy, Chesly Unruh, Morton Kaer, Cliff Reynolds, Alex Graham, Charles Webber, Jesse Hill, Henry Coggeshall, Melbourne Ofstad, Lee Barnes, Jack Williams, Spencer Boelter and Joe Aleksl.

Although Stanford is favored to win the meet, reports from the East indicate that squads there will be strong in many events. U.S.C. faces some real competition other than that afforded by Stanford. For the benefit of those who are vitally interested, the following data on eastern men is offered:

Mile: Haggerty (Harvard) 4m. 27.2s.
