Academy, the same school that produced Borah.

Weldon Draper, who did not compete in the sprints for the Trojans last year because of a flock of ailments, proved to Cromwell's satisfaction that he has returned to form by capturing the 110-yard dash in 11s., even time. Draper nosed out Jimmy Payne, the sensational sophomore hurdler, whom Cromwell is also converting into a sprinter as well as a timber-topper.

"Sandy" Wehner, former Brawley High School dash star, captured the freshman 110-yard sprint. His time was 11 1-5s. Rucker chased Wehner to the tape for second place.

J. Wakefield Burke, a transfer to Southern California from Chicago, captured the freshman 440-yard dash in 50s. flat, which was better time than that turned in by Chink Sauers, who nosed out Bruce Smith in the varsity quarter-mile dash in the time of 51 1-5s. Had Burke ran in the varsity race a whale of a battle would have resulted for both Sauers and Smith need someone to set a speedy pace for them. As it was, both Sauers and Smith set a slow pace and won by uncorking their terrific sprints.

Orphus Kirks, another sophomore, broke the tape in the half-mile in 2m. 3-5s. Schurr, Adams and Gloege, who took the other three places, all finished under 2m. 02s.

The broad jump brought out a lot of long leapers, with Howard Paul, a freshman, winning the event with a jump of 25ft. 4in. Paul, former Santa Ana High star, got off another leap of 23ft. 9in. but had one spike over the take-off board. Jesse Hill took second with a jump of 22ft. 11in., while Selby was third with 22ft. 9 1/2 in. Cliff Reynolds leaped 22ft. but was nosed out of fourth place by Walker, who jumped two inches farther.

Reynolds captured the 120-yard high hurdles in 15 1-5s. and figures to get down around 14 3-5s. by the time the Stanford and California meets roll around.

Jim Stewart, sophomore iron man, won the shotput, discus and high jump, heaving the Greek platter 138ft. 1in. for his best performance.
