Running high jump, final—**Robert W. King**, Stanford, and **Charles E. McGinnis**, C.A.A., tied for first at 6ft. 5 in. (King won jump-off for first); third, **Harold M. Osborn**, I.A.C., 6ft. 4 in.; fourth, **Den Hedges, Jr.**, N.Y.A.C., 6ft. 3 in.

Pole vault, final—Three tied for first, **Lee Barnes**, L.A.A.C.; **William Droegmueller**, Northwestern University, and **Sabin Carr**, Yale, 13ft. 9 in. (Barnes won jump off for first, Droegmueller was conceded second by Carr); **Charles W. McGinnis**, C.A.C., and **Jack Williams**, L.A.A.C., were tied at 13ft. nin. (McGinnis won jump-off for fourth place.) **Frank H. Wirsig**, United States Marine Corps; **Harry L. Devoe**, B.A.A.; **W. R. O'Dell**; **Clemson College**; **Tom Marme**, Northwestern, and **Ward Edmonds**, Stanford, also competed. (Edmonds' O'Dell and Wirsig cleared 13ft.)
