

Houser Record in Discus is Accepted

Official notification that his mark of 158ft. 1 3-4in. had been accepted as a new world's record has been received by Clarence L. (Bud) Houser, the well-known dentist. The former Trojan athlete announced yesterday, between practice tosses, that he had received word from F. W. Rubien, national A.A.U. official. Houser set his record in the Stanford-Trojan meet at Palo Alto in April, 1926. Hoffmeister, the giant German, later was credited with tosses longer than Houser's, but investigation showed that the mathematicians had made a mistake in changing meters to feet, and that Houser's mark was still unbeaten.
