

WYKOFF EQUALS RECORD

Trojan Sprinter Covers Hundred-Yard Dash in 9.6 at Fresno Relays

FRESNO STADIUM, FRESNO, April 26. (AP)—Under the brilliance of sixty huge electric lights, the pick of the Far West's track-and-field athletes made their bids for national and world's records here tonight in the fourth annual west coast relays.

It was one of the few times in the history of track-and-field competition that a meet was held outdoors at night. The meet, held in connection with the Raisin Day Festival, attracted a throng estimated at 6500 persons.

Clear, cool weather furnished conditions considered ideal for the meet. More than 250 athletes competed.

Frank Wykoff, University of Southern California speedster, and joint holder of the 9.6s. world's record for the 100, equalled that time in winning his heat. Russell

Sweet of the San Francisco Olympic Club captured the second heat in the time of 9.8s.

TRACK STARS LEAVE FRESNO

Southern California Varsity Carries Off Top Honors by Scoring 77 Points; Wykoff Twice Equals World Record in 100—Rothert Wins Over Brix

FRESNO, April 27.—Track athletes were pulling out of Fresno today, headed for home after the third annual West Coast Relay meet staged here last night. The University of Southern California team carried off scoring honors in Class A, getting 77 points to enjoy a wide lead over the Los Angeles Athletic Club in second place with 37.

Frank Wykoff, swift blond youngster, who races under the colors of the University of Southern California, won both his heat and the finals of the 100-yard dash, Class A event in the time of 9 6-10s. It equaled the recognized world's record. The Glendale youth won as he pleased, with at least three yards to spare each time.

First place in five relay races, 440-yard, 880-yard, mile, two-mile and four-mile, and the 100, plus a generous helping of second and lesser positions, brought the Tro-

jans their impressive victory.

The Class A, two-mile relay was handed to Southern California on a silver platter, as it were, as the four boys only had to finish their laps, time being a minor matter. The L.A.A.C. team withdrew owing to the illness of Percy Niernbach.

In winning the Class A shotput, Harlow Robert, stalwart Stanford ace, contributed a thrilling chapter to the book of athletic achievements. The big blonde boy, competing unattached, came to Fresno by airplane from Stanford University, where, this afternoon, he won his favorite event in the dual meet with Washington. With a heave of 51ft. 4in. tonight, Robert noosed out Herman Britz of the Los Angeles Athletic Club, holder of the American record of 53ft. 4in. Britz stopped at 50ft. 11 1-4in. tonight. In the Washington meet, he tossed the pellet, 51ft. 4 3-4in.

Eric Krenz, another one of Stanford's "strong boys," followed in the footsteps of his team mate, Robert, by winning the discus throw. He also captured individual high-point honors, with 7, by taking third in the shotput. In the discus, he sent the platter sailing 156ft. 5 1/2in. This afternoon in Stanford Stadium against Washington, he won the event with a throw of 151ft. 7 3-8in. Krenz also came down by plane to compete unattached.

Individual high-point laurels in the Class B competition were claimed by Bishop of Pomona College who registered 10. He took first places in the javelin throw and high jump with marks of 181ft. 8 1/2in. and 6ft. 1in., respectively.

Jimmy De Mers of the Los Angeles Athletic Club picked off first place in the Class A javelin throw in easy fashion, while his teammate, Eaton, annexed second position. De Mers's throw was 212ft. 2in.
