

SAGEHENS BEAT TROJANS

Pomona Track Team Wins Handicap Meet, 66 1-3 to 64 2-3 as McGeagh Shines in Taking Half Mile

Making good use of the handicaps awarded them, the Pomona College Sagehens scored a 66 1-3 to 64 2-3 victory over Southern California in a well-matched meet at Claremont yesterday afternoon.

Due to Dean Cromwell's desire that his boys go through a genuinely strenuous workout the Pomona

runners and field men were generously handicapped and in one or two instances the Trojans had no chance to finish first. Outside of the two-mile and high jump, however, there was plenty of excitement and the competition was close enough to give

the Trojans all the exercise they wanted.

Bill McGeagh turned in the greatest race of the day when he won the 880 from scratch in the excellent time of 1m. 57 2-5s. Bill spotted McBride of Pomona 60 yards and then beat him in a driving finish which gave the fans a big kick. McGeagh looks like one sure first-place winner for S.C. against Stanford in May.

RANEY WINS

Frank Wykoff was the victim of too tough a job in the 100, due to the fact that Joe Raney of Pomona is in reality a 10 1-5s. sprinter where the writer, who handicapped the meet, had been led to believe that Raney could do no better than 10 2-5s. Wykoff spotted Raney seven yards yesterday and made up exactly five of this in a great race which was timed in 9.5s. This time proved that Raney can do 10 1-5s., so the handicap of seven yards was not fair to Wykoff, who nevertheless was timed in 9 3-5s. himself.

Frank ran the furlong later, spotted his team-mate, Milton Maurer, seven yards, and won coasting the last 40 yards and encouraging Maurer into third place. Wykoff's time was 21.5s.

while some watches caught him at 21 1-5a.

Vic Williams, although placing third in the 440, did the one-lap dash in 48 3-5a. The event was won by Smith of Pomona, who started twenty-four yards ahead of Williams. Art Woessner of S.C. finished right on Smith's heels and Williams close to Woessner's shoulders. It was a corking race, run around two curves, with all three placers within a yard of each other at the tape.

TWO-MILE WALKAWAY

The two-mile, which looms as S.C.'s weakest event this year, was strictly a two-man race between Cunliffe and Fukushima of Pomona, both of whom started with liberal handicaps over Learned and Unruh of the Trojans. Neither S.C. man ran under 10m. 30a., so the handicaps awarded the Sagehens were made to look rather ridiculous. Cromwell will have to dug up a two-miler before the Stanford meet or the Trojans will drop 9 points in this event.

Many Trojans fell below their best efforts in the field and this cost S.C. the meet. The pole vaulters couldn't clear 13ft., which hurt, and Jim Stewart failed to measure up to his usual 6ft. 4in. in the high jump. In the shot and discus, Jim was also below form and Pomona copped 10 points in these events. Stewart threw 41ft. and 129ft. He generally does 44ft. and 135ft. McKenzie was six feet behind his usual javelin throw.

Cliff Halstead, star Trojan miler, with a fine chance of winning his event, dropped out after three and one-third laps, having been ill last week with the flu. Callahan, starting twenty yards ahead of Cliff, ran a nice race and won in 4m. 28 3-5a.

Duncan Powers, although unplaced in the low hurdles, ran his race from scratch in 23 4-5a., which indicates he will gallop right along with Capt. Payne and Carls in the big meets.

The meet, being a handicap affair, was supposed to end in a tie, but something went wrong with the writer's logarithm figures and there was one and two-thirds points difference when the affair ended.
