*Interclass Meet Reveals
Improvement*

*Juniors Capture Event With
Points to Spare*

*Delby Better Even Time in
Both Sprints*

Dink Templeton may have it all figured out that he is going to hang it on Southern California's track and field team in that big dual meet on May 2, but Dink had better be careful about counting his points before they are manufactured.

The Trojans held their interclass meet at Bovard Field yesterday afternoon, members of the junior class winning all by themselves. This fact, however, is merely incidental alongside of the fine showing made by Dean Cromwell's performers in all but three events. Dean's boys are coming along slowly but surely and by the time May 2 rolls around the sons of Troy will be ready for everything that Templeton can send at them.

Cliff Halstead, Harold Ham-matt and Learned ran a pulse-quickenning mile, bunched at every turn and Cliff won with that driving, powerful finish of his in the excellent time of 4m. 25s. This figure fractured his own Bovard Field mark of 4m. 27s.

Joe Bills and Bert Ritchey ran side by side over a flight of high hurdles with the former nudging the tape a fraction of an inch before his opponent got there. The time was 151-10s., which is the fastest Bills ever ran.

In the absence of Frank Wyckoff, who watched the meet in civilian clothes due to a cold, Roy Delby captured both sprints, the 100 going in 9.9s. and the furlong, run around a curve, in 21.7s., which is radiating considerable rapidity.

Bob Hall, for the third consecutive Saturday, showed improvement in the discus, tossing the platter 149ft. 1in. He did only 45ft. 7in. in the shot, but has not been working much on this event due to an injured wrist.

Dick Barber's leap of 24ft. 3in. broke his own Bovard Field record of 23ft. 11in. in the broad jump. Barber is old man consistency at better than 24ft. these days.

Chesley Unruh won the two-

mile in 10m. 4s., which shows improvement in this event, the Trojans being lamentably weak here. Cromwell is planning a surprise, however, and if it materializes the Trojans won't donate 9 points to Templeton in this race.

Performances in the pole vault, javelin and shot were only mediocre and it is in these events that the Trojans must make progress prior to the Stanford meet.

The juniors wound up with 78 points, followed by the freshmen with 26½, sophomores with 25½ and seniors with 23. Capt. Ernie Payne, although recovered from his recent illness, was not able to compete in the low hurdles, which probably cost the seniors second place in the meet.
