

# BRIX SHATTERS SHOT-PUT MARK

*Mercury Weight Star Shoves  
Ball 52ft. 1 3-8in.*

*Barber and Walker Shine in  
Broad Jump*

*Trojans Take Four of Five  
Relay Events*

Featured by a record-breaking heave of the shot by Herman Brix and some sensational broad jumping by Dick Barber and Hap Walker the thirteenth annual Southern Pacific A.A.U. relay championships were staged before a capacity crowd at Long Beach yesterday afternoon.

Brix set a new Southern Pacific A. A. U. record with his throw of 52ft. 1 3-8in., cracking his old mark of 51ft. 7in. set last year on the same field.

Barber and Walker put on a great act in their specialty, first one leading and then the other until Dick finally emerged victorious by the infinitesimal margin of one-fourth of an inch. His leap measured 34ft. 6 3-4in. Walker had led for a long time at 34ft. 6 1/2in., and on one occasion made a Herculean leap of 35ft. 5in., only to foul by a mere whisker. Both boys had many jumps over 34ft., which is unusual leaping for so early in the year.

Frank Wykoff, world's record holder in the 100-yard dash, ran the last lap on two winning Southern California relay teams. The Trojans coming home well in front in the quarter and half-mile events. In the one-lap dash Wykoff, with Delby, Parsons and Guyer preceding him, helped set a new record of 41.8s., the old mark being one-tenth of a second slower.

The Trojans took four out of the five open relay races, winning the two-mile and mile in addition to the sprint events. The L.A.A.C. annexed the four-mile jaunt.

Koenig, Southern California freshman sprinter, won the open novice 100, barely nosing out Burch of Jordan in a terrific finish. The time was 10s. flat.

Henry Lasalette of L.A.A.C. defeated Jim Stewart in the high jump, clearing 6ft. 3 1/2in., while Stewart went out at one and one-half inches below this height.

Coach Bert Jamieson and his Sherman Indians, running under the colors of the L.A.A.C., won the first five places in the ten-mile marathon. Elmo was first in the good time of 57m. 4 1-5s., with Suha second and Denver third.

The meet, embracing thirty-three events with several heats, was run off in fine style by Walter Scott and other Long Beach officials, who are looking forward to their participation in the 1932 Olympic Games.
