

FOUR NEW TRACK MARKS SET BY TROJAN RUNNERS

Four new all-time Trojan track and field records have been established and one old mark has been tied during the present season, it was shown yesterday when Director of Athletics Willis O. Hunter prepared a revised list of S.C. records.

The new Trojan marks are Vic Williams's 48 1-5s. in the 440, Cliff Halstead's 4m. 19 2-5s. in the mile, Chesley Unruh's 9m. 42s. in the two mile and the mile relay time of 3m. 15 4-5s. set by Ernest Oswald, Bob Dow, Art Woessner and Vic Williams. The tied record was Capt. Ernest Payne's 23 2-5s. in the low hurdles, which equaled the mark of Jimmy Payne, set in 1928, and Kenneth Grumbles, set in 1926.

In the new records set this year, it does not appear that the men who made them have yet reached their peak and still better marks

may be made in these events before the close of the 1931 track season.

Two-mile—9m. 42s., Chesley Unruh, 1931.

High hurdles—14 3-5s., Leighton Dye, 1926.

Low hurdles—23 2-5s., Kenneth Grumbles, 1926; James Payne, 1928; Ernest Payne, 1931.

Mile relay—3m. 15 4-5s., 1931, team of Oswald, Dow, Woessner and Williams.

Pole vault—14ft. 1½in., Lee Barnes, 1928 (world's record.)

High jump—6ft. 7¼in. (old standards.) Bob Van Osdel, 1930; 6ft. 6¼in. (new standards.) James Stewart, 1930.

Broad jump—25ft. ¾in., Jesse Hill, 1929. (I.C.A.A.A. record.)

Shot put—50ft. 7¼in., Bud Houser, 1926.

Discus throw—158ft. 1¼in., Bud Houser, 1926.

Javelin throw—204ft. 9.75 in., Jesse Mortensen, 1929.
