

# GREAT BATTLE LOOMS IN FINALS OF SPRINT

## Trojan Star and Stanford Flash Make Same Time in Heats of 100-Yard Run at Fresno

FRESNO, May 9.—Frank Wykoff of the University of Southern California and Hec Dyer of Stanford, old rivals in the sprints, made identically the same time in their heats of the 100-yard dash here this afternoon in the annual West Coast Relays.

Wykoff won his heat in 9 3-5s., followed by Taylor of the Los Angeles Athletic Club. The second heat found Dyer making the same time, with Ken Robinson, also of the L.A.A.C., right on his heels.

Floyd Wilson, Riverdale High School student, today set what will probably be recognized as a new world's inter-scholastic record when in the Class C,

or high school, division of the West Coast Relays he made a broad jump of 23ft. 10 3-4in. The previous world's record of 23ft. 7in. was made in 1913 by P. Stiles of Culver Military Academy.

Garrett of Mt. Diablo High School broke the West Coast Relays record in Class C pole vault when he cleared 12ft. 3-4in. The old mark was held by Antonio of Fresno at 12ft. 3-16in.

Visalia won the Class C division with 22 points; Roosevelt High of Fresno and Hanford were tied for second with 9 each; Merced and Taft tied for third with 8; Sanger, 7; Porterville, Fowler, Selma, 6 each; Mt. Diablo, 5; Coalinga, Galileo, Riverdale, Strathmore, 4; Lindsay, Dinuba and San Francisco Poly Tech, 3 each; Bakersfield, Madera, Reedley and Kingsburg, 2 each.

Bruckner of Galileo High School, San Francisco, broke the West Coast Relays record in Class C division of the javelin with a heave of 181ft. 6 1/2-in. The old record was held by Dave Brase of Fresno Tech at 178ft. 3in. Summary:
