

PERCY WILLIAMS BOWS TO TROJAN SPEEDSTER

Olympic Games Sprint Champion Fourth in Hundred-Yard Dash at Night Meet

The Williams family broke even last night at the Olympic Stadium when Vic Williams defeated his rival Ben Eastman of Stanford in a special quarter-mile dash, and Frank Wykoff swept to unquestioned superiority over Percy Williams, Canadian Olympic Games champion in the highly advertised "Race of a Lifetime."

+ Wykoff equaled the official world's record of 9.5s. in defeating Williams, who finished fourth behind Emmett Toppino of Loyola of New Orleans and Cy Leland of the Olympic Club, who were second and third, respectively.

Toppino led for the first twenty-five yards, with Wykoff catching him at the forty-yard mark and passing him at the sixty. The flying Southern California sprinter rapidly drew away from the field and won by a yard over Toppino.

The quarter-mile dash was a special race between Vic Williams curly-headed Trojan star, and the lanky Eastman of Stanford, with little Ray Alf of the L.A.A.C. pacing the two. Alf set a fast pace for the first 220 with Eastman close behind him. About seventy yards from the finish Williams started his famous sprint and gradually drew up alongside the flying Eastman. A few yards from the finish he passed the blond Stanford runner and won by approximately two yards. The time was 48.2s., exactly one full second behind the world's record which each runner had tied this year.

McCARTHY VICTOR

John McCarthy, strong runner from Fairfax High, won the open quarter-mile dash in 48.7s., with McKennon of the L.A.A.C., second.

Alma Richards broke the fifty-six-pound weight record by tossing the ball 54ft. 9in. Bowman of the Mercuries was second.

Records started falling as soon as the meet started. The first event on the huge program, the six-mile run, saw the first meet mark shattered when Elmo of the L.A.A.C. crossed the finish line in the sensational time of 31m. 38s., for a new record. His team-mates, Suhu and Lewis, were second and third, respectively, while Fred Ward of the Millrose A.C., finished fourth. Ward recently won The Times Pre-Olympic Marathon.

Harry Hinkel of the L.A.A.C. broke his own record in the three-mile walk, doing the distance in 22m. 16.6s. Weiss, Chisholm and

HOPSON COPS DASH

Walter Hopson, colored sprinter from L. A. Poly, won the novice 100-yard dash in 10s. Two false starts slowed up the youngsters. Foy Draper of Huntington Park High was second with Charlie Parsons, Jr., of the L.A.A.C. third.

Orval Martin proved too strong a runner for the rest of the milers, winning in 4m. 22.6s. Folke Skoog of Caltech was second with John Wall of Roosevelt High third.

Occidental was in the limelight in the high hurdles, Wendel Smith, former Bengal iron-man winning the event with Jimmy Meeks, sensational Oxy sophomore second. Both runners competed for the L.A.A.C. last night. Smith's time was 14.8.

The veteran L.A.A.C. runner, Dick Pomeroy equaled his own 440 hurdle record in that event by winning in 53.8s. Al Vignola, competing unattached, was second with Dick Parslow, also unattached, third.

Jackie Burton of the Mercuries took the half-mile in 1m. 55.5s, with Carl Saterfield, star colored runner from Manual Arts High, second.

Herman Brix, giant Mercury shot putter, won the sixteen-pound event with a heave of 51ft. 5 1-4in.
