Powerful S.C. Team Appears in 1932 Debut

Potential Olympic Games Stars in Action

Meeks to Push Welsh and Payne in Hurdles

last year, appears in its 1932 debut today at Patterson Field, Eagle Rock. The S.C. aggregation faces Occidental's short-panted athletes in a handicap meet which ought to provide a flock of thrills.

Last season a similar meet resulted in an easy victory for the Trojans.

More generous handicaps have been allotted the Tigers today by a committee composed of George Davis, Harry Culver and Braven Dyer. Coaches Cromwell and Joe Pipal may agree to handicaps in the sprints before the start of today's meet, although none are listed at present.

In the hurdles Pipal advocates removal of the last two hurdles from the track for all of his athletes but Jimmy Meeks, who is on a par with Jimmy Payne and Jedy Welsh of S.C. in the matter of timber-topping ability. This would make a much more interesting finish for these two races.

Appearance of such stars as Frank Wykoff, Art Woessner, Cliff Halstead, Payne, Welsh, Carls, Bill Draber, Jim Stewart, Henry Lassalette and Bob Hall will be watched with interest inasmuch as all of these are strong candidates for the Olympic Games team.

Occidental has the class of the Southern California Conference and with such athletes as Bellman, Meeks, Bailey, McKee, Forbes, Finley and others figures to give S.C. a good workout, provided the handicaps are somewhere near what they ought to be.
