

COMPTON JAYSEE STARS SHINE AGAINST TROJANS

Still half-scared by the results of the inadvertent tremors of old Mother Earth, athletes comprising the Compton Jaysee track team conflicted with Southern California's freshmen, varsity, alumni and whoever else happened to be around in a thoroughly impromptu workout held yesterday afternoon on Bovard Field. No score was kept on the meet, while several field events, namely the shot put and discus, were not staged.

The outstanding performance of the day was credited to Kenny Griffin, Compton javelin thrower, who hurled the spear 171ft., his farthest heave to date. Joe Fox, half-pint Tartar sprinter, shone by winning both of his heats in the century and the furlong.

Many veterans of the track and field competed. Vic Williams, former national quarter-mile champion, ran the century and won his heat in the one-lap event.

Simeon Toribio, late of the Philippines Olympic team and now enrolled at S.C., won the high jump at 6ft. 2½in. All marks were considerably retarded by the poor condition of the field, while the Compton lads, lacking a training field, did not seem to be in the best fettle.
